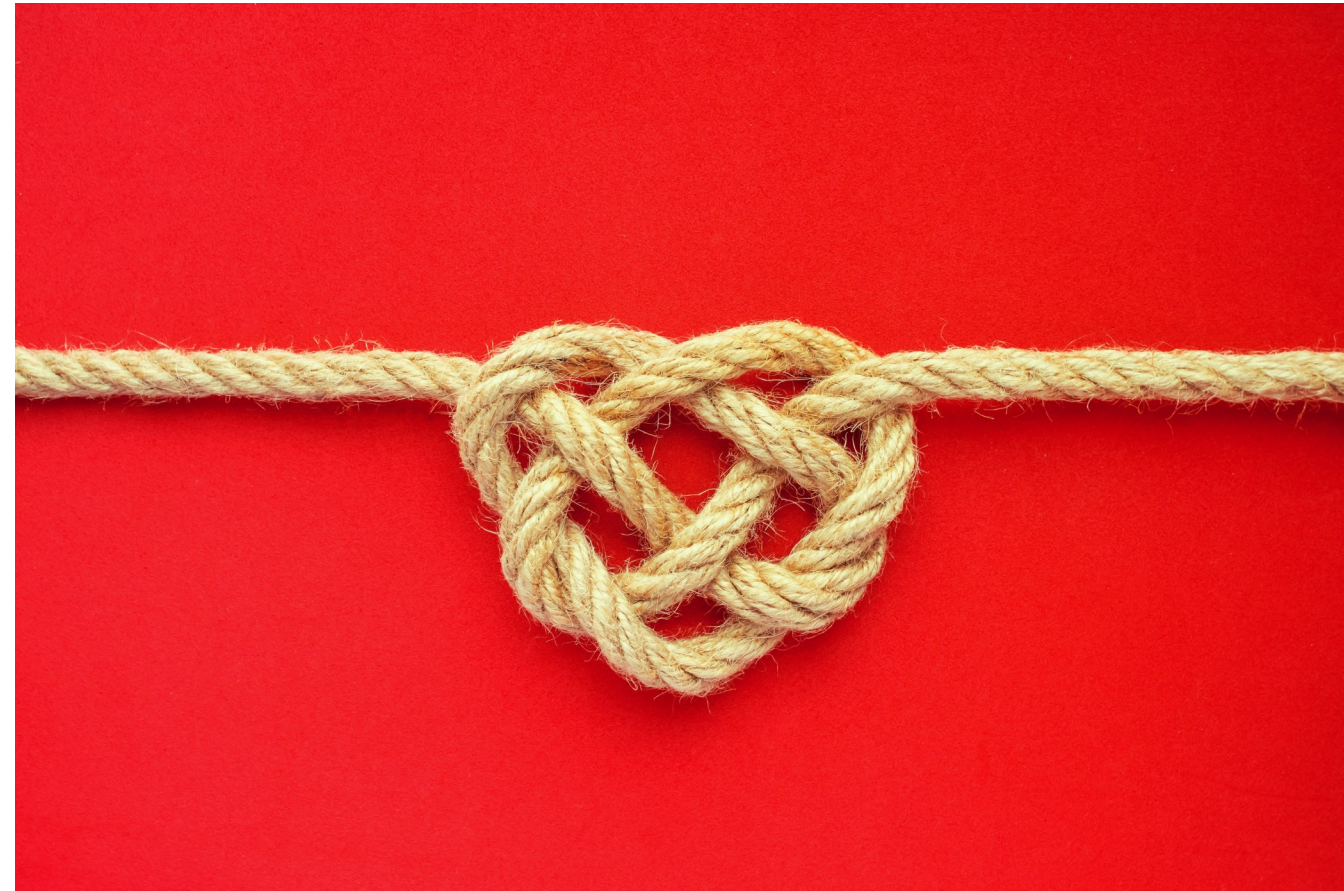

## Meditations For Your Week

Sunday, June 7 ~ Saturday, June 13, 2020

**Sunday:** *“Teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.” Matthew 28:20.* When you feel alone, God is with you. When the weight of uncertainty and pain of decision-making sits on your chest, the Holy Spirit hovers nearby. The promise of the Triune God, Creator, Redeemer, Sustainer, is God is always with you.

**Monday:** *“When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways.” 1 Corinthians 13: 11.* The movement from childhood to adulthood in maturity is not always chronological. Pray for spiritual maturity. Pray to develop new responses nagging issues that put God at the center.

**Tuesday:** *“For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known.” 1 Corinthians 13: 12.* Consider that God always has a fuller view. Ask God for wisdom and insight, even as the way might not fully be clear.

**Wednesday:** *“And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.” 1 Corinthians 13:13.* Pray for expressions of God’s love in our world. Amplify God’s love whenever you can.

**Thursday:** *“Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted.” Matthew 28: 16-17.* Doubt and faith are not in opposition, but in the same group. They are often in the same person. Ask questions; be curious. The disciples did.

**Friday:** *“And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.” Matthew 28: 18.* Jesus always used authority to give and share with others. Pray for those in authority and leadership. Pray for their hearts of courage and compassion.

**Saturday:** *“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,” Matthew 28:19.* God created humanity to live in community, in relationship. God has always been in relationship with God’s own self. Give thanks for the inspiration of the Trinity, who creates, redeems, and sustains.

**FOOD PANTRY:** Did you know that our food pantry is providing food and primary household products to an average of 50-60 families every week? This increase represents 5-5.5 times the number of bags of groceries than we had provided by this week, last year, and 12 times as many bags as three years ago by this week in 2017. With your generosity and our collaboration with our community partners, we are feeding our neighbors, discovering their need for rental and utility assistance, and disseminating information about public health.

We can also store and distribute fresh produce and proteins. As your garden grows, consider sharing with the food pantry. If you have eggs, consider sharing some with your neighbors. Neighbors feeding and caring for neighbors is at the heart of our ministry. Serving God and God's people is our mission. You can drop off your items **Monday, Wednesday, Friday 9- noon** in the shopping cart by the office. Also, if you could use help this season, please come on **Thursdays between 4-6pm** for food.

## Baptism of Abigail Hope Stephenson

Pastor:

Brothers and sisters in Christ: Through the Sacrament of Baptism we are initiated into Christ's holy Church. We are incorporated into God's mighty acts of salvation and given new birth through water and the Spirit. All this is God's gift, offered to us without price.

I present Abigail Stephenson for baptism

On behalf of the whole Church, I ask you:

Do you renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of your sin?

**Parents: We do.**

Pastor: Do you accept the freedom and power God gives you to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves?

**Parents: We do.**

Pastor: Do you confess Jesus Christ as your Savior, put your whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as your Lord, in union with the Church which Christ has opened to people of all ages, nations, and races?

**Parents: We do.**

Pastor: Will you nurture Abigail in Christ's holy Church, that by your teaching and example she may be guided to accept God's grace for themselves, to profess her faith openly, and to lead a Christian life?

**Parents: we will.**

Pastor: (to the congregation): Do you, as Christ's body, the Church, reaffirm both your rejection of sin and your commitment to Christ?

Pastor: (to congregation):

Will you nurture one another in the Christian faith and life and include these persons now before you in your care? Will you proclaim the good news and live according to the example of Christ, surrounding surround this family with a community of love and forgiveness, that they may grow in their trust of God, and be found faithful in their service to others? Will you pray for them, that they may be true disciples who walk in the way that leads to life?

**Congregation: We will.**

Pastor: Let us join together in professing the Christian faith as contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments.

**All:**

**I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

**I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, [who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

After the flood you set in the clouds a rainbow. When you saw your people as slaves in Egypt, you led them to freedom through the sea. Their children you brought through the Jordan to the land which you promised.

In the fullness of time you sent Jesus, nurtured in the water of a womb. He was baptized by John and anointed by your Spirit. He called his disciples to share in the baptism of his death and resurrection and to make disciples of all nations.
