Greetings in the Name of Christ!

What a great honor and joy it is for Julie and me to be serving God in West Grove. There are so many great, faithful ways to share and serve Christ together here. We feel very blessed. We look forward to getting to know you as we share fellowship together. We purchased a home in Avondale and have made a commitment to being here and accessible to the community. First, I want to celebrate Pastor Monica and her family and the ministries she has shared here. I see a lot of hard work and a very professional, wide-reaching approach to ministry and discipleship. As I meet people and hear more about the ministries and fellowship here, I see extraordinary connections to the community. I look forward to continuing the building of trust; I'm very grateful for the ways worship and prayer and community gatherings, along with the food bank have served through the pandemic.

I look forward to taking the first step of getting to know all of you and the community better. I expect to continue to use Zoom calls and as the pandemic subsides, eventually return to offering personal visits. Once we go to green, I'm planning on offering office hours most week day mornings, and also set some additional, specific times to meet. If possible, perhaps an option in the time ahead would be to meet outside at a safe distance with masks.

Walk Together

Many people like to be doing something when we talk. Shooting pool, shooting basketball, or walking are examples. In one of the churches I served, we realized we couldn't just expect to sit and wait for people to come to us; we needed to go out and walk in the neighborhoods and pray for the people who lived there. We went on prayer walks and prayed for insight to understand what people were going through and how to faithfully respond and share our friendship and fellowship in Christ. The times we walked and prayed were full of blessings, not just for the insight about the neighborhoods, but also for the time we spent together walking and praying with each other. I think we became more prepared and open to people new to us through our practice.

So as the time unfolds and restrictions are lifted, perhaps there are times when I can come out and walk in your neighborhood with you and pray for the people who live there; we seek to let God open our eyes, our ears, our minds and hearts to what God wants to reveal; we want to become more aware of how God may be calling to us to reach out to others and include them in our fellowship. We want to live in God's vision for our lives and the life of our community.

I want to hear more about your faith journey, stories about your life and what is important to you. How did you come to be a Christian? Who was important in your personal growth? What scripture or Christian songs have been most important to you? How did you come to be at West Grove UMC? What hopes do you have for our fellowship? What vision might God be casting for our life? My hope is that I can be a resource for helping you grow closer to God in new ways, and to also learn from you.

Recordings

As I write this article, I'm preparing to make several recordings that will help me introduce myself to the community, sharing more of who I am and my journey in faith. I expect to have links on the church website to those recordings. I'm not a person who likes to be in front of a camera; and except for one Julie and I took of ourselves, I've never taken a selfie. I'm also not much of a fan of Facebook, but if it helps the church reach out and build fellowship and friendships, I'll do what I can. I look forward to meeting people in person, my preferred way of communication.

A Faithful Response

The murder of George Floyd in Minneapolis by a police officer has been a horrible event for our nation. Eight and a half minutes is a long time. His death has humbled us through its brutality and total lack of empathy or concern for the sacred miracle of human life. We hope and pray it marks the beginning of a

point of transformation for our nation and world, especially within our hearts. I have two friends who are police officers, and they are just as horrified as anyone about the events. It was discouraging to anyone who believes in real justice. Unfortunately it is not an isolated event, as it is one a series of events in recent years, and throughout our history. A first step to correct injustice is to bring it to light.

Those of us who are Christians can understand just how overwhelming evil can be. We cannot fight it on our own. The only way to respond to it is not through more brute force and violence, but by the grace and mercy of God in the power of the cross. What Jesus showed us, how he lived and taught with the sacrifice he made, sets a vision for our lives of how we need to respond. I am prayerful as I enter the West Grove-Avondale community, that we will be creatively led by God to help in the transformation God desires. God, in the power of the Holy Spirit, provides creative, effective ways to overwhelm evil with God's grace. God can help us see the bigger picture, while still responding in small and large ways. We pray we prepare our hearts to reach out and build stronger relationships through all of our ministries. I trust you will join me in my prayers and efforts as we move into the future.

Impact of the Virus

At times, I've tried to claim some of the feelings that many of us have had as we respond to the virus. Isolation from family and friends, and limiting our worship and fellowship in church has been a huge challenge. Cut off from the plans we may have made and hopes we had for spring, many words come to mind like cheated, or when I was a boy, we'd say, "it's a gyp." There have been many disappointments resulting from altering our plans and changing our expectations. Lives have been severely interrupted. Or worse, many people have fallen ill, or even died. It was especially challenging for me to hear of medical professionals who needed to step in and care for patients in ways pastors traditionally do. I wanted to be there. As I prayed about it, I've come away with a new dedication to make sure we are doing all we can to teach, prepare, show and train others to share our faith, including giving pastoral care, in effective ways.

There have been many times as Julie and I shared our thoughts with each other this spring, we've been able to claim that in the midst of it all that has been happening we can say we are blessed; we have stayed well, and have had the resources to respond to challenges. It has been challenging planning and living a transition in the midst of a shut down. We did our best to trust God more, seek to be aware of how we can faithfully respond, and do our best to move forward. Now that Julie and I are settling in, we look forward to the times ahead as we share faith together. We look for your help and openness of heart.

Going Green

On June 19, it was announced that we would go green on Friday, June 26. It seemed like great news. (Finally, a hair cut!) Yet, in the midst of trying to reclaim our lives, we still need to be very vigilant in working to prevent the spread of the disease. A mandate for us is to do no harm. As we look ahead, we need to manage our expectations. We are not likely to go "back to normal." Many of the things we choose to do, we need to do not just for ourselves, but also for the health and safety of the community. As hard as it is for Methodists to do, we might not be singing in worship for a while. We will likely need to limit or eliminate our handshakes and hugs and fellowship time with food or coffee for many months. Extra care will likely be required for a while into the future in cleaning and sanitizing as we work to prevent the return and spread of the virus.

We know that in the wake of such a tragic, world-wide event there is a lot of uncared for grief, anger, and pain in the hearts and lives of people everywhere. God calls us to discipleship that is willing to respond and grow in new ways, in the Way that Christ leads. One of the first steps we can take is we are called to live lives of empathy and put our caring hearts into action in real ways. Active listening, as we seek to understand is a faithful way to embody God's love to each other. I pray you will join us and share in the journey, sharing from your heart. May we live in the wisdom and guidance God provides and know that our faith is our greatest treasure.



FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

Our church food pantry continues to meet the needs of families in our community. The church family has been very generous with food donations and monetary gifts. As a tier two provider for the Chester County Food Bank we are fortunate to receive pre-made food bags and produce from them. We are also blessed by one of the girls in a scout troop that meets at our church who has been donating the produce from her garden to our food pantry. After soaring to a high of nearly 70 families, on a weekly basis, the numbers have fallen. We have consistently been serving 20 to 25 families each week the last several weeks. We hope this is an indication that more people are back to work and finding a stronger financial foothold. We look forward to your continued support of this ministry as we move throughout the summer months.

Our Food Pantry is open every Thursday from 4-6 pm.

Here are the most needed items: Cereal, Rice, Beans (dried and canned); Pasta and Sauces; Vegetables and Fruits (fresh); Canned Proteins (Chicken, Tuna, and Beans); Paper Towels, Toilet Paper, Clorox Wipes, baby wipes; Peanut Butter and Jelly; Toothpaste, Deodorant. **Thank you!**



Bishop's Annual Conference 2020 Update

Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ,

I am writing to let the Eastern Pennsylvania Annual Conference know that I have prayerfully decided that the bulk of our Annual Conference session this fall will be virtual and not in-person (face to face). The continual rise in COVID 19 cases, the threat of a second wave in the fall, the age of most of our constituents, and the budgetary challenges we are facing has led me to this decision.

I will be meeting with the annual conference session committees to determine the details and we will be in touch as plans are worked out with more specific information. We plan to keep the same dates that have been previously announced, but with a few changes. We will not be gathering at the Oaks Expo Center. Understanding that all social distancing and other health precautions will be observed, the dates are:

The schedule is as follows:

Tuesday, Oct. 13, 9:00 am – 11:00 am: Clergy Session (virtual/live streaming). There will be no laity session.

Tuesday, Oct. 13, 1:00 pm – 5:00 pm: Annual Conference (virtual/live streaming).

Wednesday, Oct. 14, 10:00 am: Memorial Service (at a local church yet to be confirmed). This will be in person but by ticket only with limited seating and live streaming available.

Wednesday, Oct. 14, 2:00 pm: Ordination Service (at a local church yet to be confirmed). This will also be in person but by ticket only with limited seating and live streaming available.

Many annual conferences across the country have opted for virtual sessions with great success so we will be able to learn from their experiences. Ensuring electronic accessibility for our voting delegates is a priority for us. We are committed to providing accessibility for individuals with disabilities and those who speak Spanish. We will also continue to receive our special Annual Conference offerings online and/or by mail.

I realize this is a huge change from what we are used to doing. The fellowship and resourcing that is typical of an in-person event will be limited and the agenda will be smaller. However, this will help us to do things in a new way that may facilitate even greater options for ministry in the future.

As Isaiah 43:19 reminds us “See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.” Our God is a way-maker, doing new things for a new generation. Please be in prayer as we embark on this venture of Annual Conference 2020.
