CNO PRESCHOOL





SCHOOL SUPPLIES: pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

face value, but the church purchases the cards at a 5% discount.

To participate in this program, just complete the order form located in the lobby, attach your check, and drop it in the offering plate or Carol Whelan's mailbox.

I usually have a supply of gift cards on hand and can give them directly to you as soon as I receive a check. If you spend \$300 a month, the church will receive \$15. In a year the church will receive \$180! If you shop at Giant, please consider purchasing a Giant Gift Card through the church. The cards come in \$25, \$50, and \$100 denominations. Questions?? 



DID YOU KNOW about Thanksgiving?

Our celebration of Thanksgiving is partially due to the work of Sarah Hale. She was born in 1788. For forty years, Hale served as the editor of Godey's Lady's Book, the most widely circulated US magazine in pre-Civil War period and it was her personal mission to make Thanksgiving a national holiday.

Hale believed that the US had too few national holidays that could be celebrated by all people. At the time, Thanksgiving was celebrated in certain states primarily in the North and was observed on different days in different locations. Hale sought to create a single holiday that would help unify the nation around a day of gratitude for one's blessings.

Beginning in 1849, she also made an annual tradition of writing to the president about the holiday. Finally, in 1863, President Lincoln, who saw the benefit of such a unifying holiday during the stress of the U.S. Civil War, supported legislation to establish the new national holiday. With Lincoln's proclamation declaring a national day of Thanksgiving on October 3, 1863, Hale's 36-year quest for Thanksgiving was finally a success.

And, incidentally, Hale is known for another enduring accomplishment; this remarkable woman is also the author of the famous poem "Mary Had a Little Lamb".



BISHOP'S DISTRICT TALKS TO COVER VARIED TOPICS

Bishop Peggy Johnson hits the road again next week with her annual Days on the Districts tour. She just completed similar visits to her Peninsula-Delaware Conference districts last week and meets this weekend with other NEJ bishops and leaders

at the Transformational Leadership Event in Hershey, PA.

The tour began Oct. 8 in the Southeast District, followed by the Central (Oct. 13) and East (Oct. 14) districts. She enlarges her territory further the ensuing week when she visits the Northeast (Oct. 20), Northwest (Oct. 22) and Southwest (Oct. 28) districts.

Bishop Peggy Johnson also met with leaders of Mission Connexions on each district. Bishop Peggy Johnson also met with leaders of Mission Connexions on each district.

Preaching from Luke's Gospel story in which Jesus returns home to Nazareth to "preach good news to the poor," Bishop Johnson will also report good news happening across the Eastern PA Conference, including growing engagement in missions and ministry, discipleship and resourcing for leaders. New Treasurer Jim Cruickshank and Pension and Health Benefits Director Jo Fielding will add to her report with remarks on conference finances and clergy benefits.

With interest mounting in denominational decision-making at the 2016 General and Northeastern Jurisdictional conferences, Bishop Johnson will give an overview of both and offer insights on several key issues. Those include: proposals to change the UMC's Book of Discipline, especially around the perennial issue of human sexuality; the organization and operation of General Conference as the representative body becomes more global; and possible, eventual downsizing of the nine NEJ episcopal areas due to membership decline.

Bishop Johnson speaking with Conference members The two-term episcopal leader will also promote the conference's new, short-term Imagine No Malaria campaign, scheduled to end December 31. She is asking churches to sponsor special fundraising and awareness events and activities, and to contribute \$10

per worshipping member to the campaign.

Bishop Johnson will complete her report with a timely focus on the topic of race relations and reconciliation, the focus also for the 2016 Annual Conference (whose central theme will be "Open Wide Your Hearts" from 2 Corinthians 6:13). She will recall: recent racial incidents, discoveries and dialogues; action steps proposed by Erin Hawkins, head of the General Commission on Religion and Race; and the Acts of Repentance toward Healing Relationships with Indigenous People (Native Americans), which the 2016 Annual Conference will culminate after four years of preparation.

As usual, the bishop will meet during the day with clergy, for whom attendance is required, and with laity in the evenings.

She will likely field questions on a variety of concerns in what may be some of the most lively district visits she has had during her tenure.

Dear Church Leader:

If your church has pledged and is meeting its commitment to the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference's "Fulfilling Our Covenant" Capital Campaign, we earnestly thank you for your faithfulness to this collective stewardship effort. Along with other participating churches, you have helped us reduce the amount that we will need to fund our Pre-82 Retired Clergy Pension Liability.

If you have not made a commitment or begun paying on it, it is not too late to do so. We will soon enter the campaign's final year, and we are prayerfully eager to finish this important race together, with faithful participation by all our churches.

For many of us, we know that coming to this point in the campaign has not been easy. In fact, for some it has been downright difficult. So, we want to say thank you not only for your faithfulness, but for your sacrifice as well.

While our goal was to raise \$3,000,000 in this campaign, local churches and individuals have committed nearly \$4,000,000; and as of September 15, 2015 we have received a total of \$2,389,137.68. This breaks down with \$2,074,226.73 as the Conference share and another \$314,910.95 being returned to local churches for their projects.

With total campaign expenses projected to be below \$400,000 we are on target to net more than \$3,000,000 by the end of the campaign, which will be the most successful capital campaign undertaken by EPAUMC. So please keep up the good work in fulfilling your campaign commitment if you have not already done so.

As we complete 2015 and begin 2016, the goal is in sight. And thus, our energy surges with confidence and the desire to complete the campaign and fulfill all our commitments. When we do, we want all of us to be able to echo the Apostle Paul's words in 2 Timothy 4:7: "We have finished the race. We have kept the faith."

As we head towards the final year, it is not too late for churches to join us in this important race, to still connect with this campaign in support of our retired clergy. Maybe your congregation was not in a position to be able to participate when the campaign began, but now you would like to join us.
