Old Testament Lessons: Isaiah 41:10-14

Do not fear, for I am with you, do not be afraid, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand. Yes, all who are incensed against you shall be ashamed and disgraced: those who strive against you shall be as nothing and shall perish. You shall seek those who contend with you, but you shall not find them; those who war against you shall be as nothing at all. For I, the Lord your God, hold your right hand; it is I who say to you, "Do not fear, I will help you." Do not fear, you worm Jacob, you insect Israel! I will help you, says the Lord; your Redeemer is the Holy One of Israel.

New Testament Lessons: Romans 8:35-39

Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

UNDERSTANDING ISLAM: BEGINS SEPTEMBER 11, 9:45 A.M.-11:00 A.M.- (Rm. TBA) -Mel Leaman, retired professor of Religion at Lincoln University will lead this study. The shared and contrasting beliefs of Islam and Christianity will be discussed. The first Sunday together will be an introduction to the topic. All are welcome each Sunday, however, participants will get the most out of this class by following the selected readings from Dr. David W. Shenk's book *Journeys of the Muslim Nation and the Christian Church: Exploring the Mission of Two Communities*. We will read two chapters each week. David Shenk has travelled the globe speaking to leading Muslim clerics and Presidents of Muslim nations. His books can be viewed on Amazon. He will join us for an evening session on Sunday, October 16 from 6:30-8:00. The theme for that evening will be "The Peace of the Gospel in Dynamic Encounter with the Peace of Islam."

- Leader: In all these things, Lord, let these backpacks and those who carry them be beacons of your eternal love, Called by you to share your love and your good Word to classmates, teachers, friends and family.

Congregation: Help these teachers and students to see that they are bathed in your love and surrounded by your care, and that you guide and direct them lovingly as they journey through life.

Leader: Help these teachers and students to utilize the many talents and skills with which you have gifted them, And to use them to your glory. If your last name ends in A-L, we ask that you provide the first four items. If your last name ends in M-Z, we ask that you provide the last three items. - **Monday:** "As it is written, 'For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered." Romans 8:36. Where are you struggling and need God?
- **Tuesday:** "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us." Romans 8:37. In the end, God is victorious. Where is God calling you to be a conqueror through God's love?
- **Wednesday:** "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 8:38. Nothing separates us from God. Prayerfully contemplate the joy of this mystery.
