

Old Testament Lesson: Psalm 146:5-10

Happy are those whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord their God, who made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them; who keeps faith forever; who executes justice for the oppressed; who gives food to the hungry. The Lord sets the prisoners free; the Lord opens the eyes of the blind. The Lord lifts up those who are bowed down; the Lord loves the righteous. The Lord watches over the strangers: he upholds the orphan and the widow, but the way of the wicked he brings to ruin. The Lord will reign forever, your God, O Zion, for all generations.



The service welcomes all with trust and understanding in what can be a very painful time of the year. The service includes the lighting of candles, meditative music, prayers, comforting scriptures, and the giving of prayer shawls.

Join us as we offer a quiet and reflective service of light in the midst of darkness.

The Lighting of the Advent Candle: The Candle of Hope: Faith! Justice!

Reader 1: A child is born to us, unto us a son is given! (Isaiah 9:6)

Congregation: The Christ child, Christ the King shall lead us!

Reader 2: Messiah calls us to live lives of faith and justice.

- Reader 1: "The fundamental fact of existence is that this trust in God, this faith, is the firm foundation under everything that makes life worth living. It's our handle on what we can't see. The act of faith is what distinguished our ancestors, set them above the crowd. By faith, we see the world called into existence by God's word, what we see created by what we don't see." (adapted from Hebrews 11: 1-3
- Reader 2: The first is the candle of Patience, reminding us to watch and wait for what God is about to do. [Light the first candle purple across from pink] The second candle of joy invites us to celebrate God's faithfulness in song and worship. [The second candle is lighted purple to the right of lit candle]
- The third candle is the candle of perspective, enabling us to look at our lives, to get rid of all those things that keep us from God, to change our ways and love as God would have us love. Light the third candle pink] The fourth candle is the candle of Faith through which we behold the love and mercy of God and believe in God's presence with us.

Congregation: Come, see the light. Let its brightness fill you. Come, feel the warmth of the light. Let it give you comfort.

- Reader 1: Come, draw near to the light, for it is God's way of breaking through to you.
- Reader 2: Come, rejoice in the light, for God is with us!
