New Testament Lesson: Ephesians 2:1-10

You were dead through the trespasses and sins in which you once lived, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient. All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of flesh and senses, and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else. But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God— not the result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life.

Gospel Lesson: John 3:14-21

And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed. But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God."

The missions team of West Grove UMC in conjunction with Family Promise of Southern Chester County is evaluating the possibility of being a host church for homeless families in Southern Chester County.

A host church provides overnight accommodations for up to five families /

every 3 months. These carefully screened families are provided shelter, meals, and support services to help them get back into housing with a goal period of 30 days.

Family Promise has a day center that is located in downtown West Grove where the families are able to shower and receive support services for getting back on their feet.

A host church provides:

Sleeping accommodations ;A living area / hospitality room A Dining area; Evening Meals; Simple Breakfasts; Bag lunches Compassion and hospitality

For a church to effectively run this program, a crew of 40 volunteers is needed for the following roles:

Coordinators (2-4); Meal Preparers / Food providers (14) Overnight Volunteers (14); Set-up / Take-Down (2-4) Linen Laundry (2); Activities (2); Supplies (many)

Meditations For Your Week



March 15—March 21

- **Sunday:** "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." John 3:16. This scripture is one of the most memorized verses. How is God calling you to hear it fresh today?
- **Monday:** "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." John 3: 17. Through Jesus, we are saved. Have you spent time with the Christ who saved you, today?
- **Tuesday:** "And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil." John 3: 19. People love the darkness. Where is God calling you to notice that you are in the dark, and then to turn the light of God into that corner of your life?
- **Wednesday:** "But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God." John 3:21. Take some time in quiet prayer today. Ask God to show you today how you can serve in the light.
- **Thursday:** "But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which God loved us," Ephesians 2:4. The love of God comes not from what we do, but comes from the mercy of God. God's love reaches beyond, through, and around our brokenness
- **Friday:** "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God-- not the result of works, so that no one may boast." Ephesians 2:8-9. God's gift is not just to you; it is a gift to ALL! Share that gift with someone new today.
- **Saturday:** "For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life," Ephesians 2:10. God prepared you for good works. How are you living that out?
