

Forgiveness

Then Peter came and said to him, "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.

The Parable of the Unforgiving Servant

"For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him; and, as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, and payment to be made. So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' And out of pity for him, the lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow slaves who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat, he said, 'Pay what you owe.' Then his fellow slave fell down and pleaded with him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he would pay the debt. When his fellow slaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. Then his lord summoned him and said to him, You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. Should you not have had mercy on your fellow slave, as I had mercy on you?' And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he would pay his entire debt. So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart."

Radical Forgiveness

For the month of July, we are in series about radical forgiveness that God calls us to offer to others. Briefly, we have learned:

Week 1: Forgiveness is not forgetting, but remembering and redeeming.

Week 2: Forgiveness is a repeated act, that changes us into conduits of God's grace.

Week 3: Forgiveness is not a feeling, but actions of reconciliation and justice

Week 4: (July 26th is coming)

If you'd like to bring a bag of chips, some cookies, or side dish, they will be appreciated, but are by no means mandatory. The event is totally free. Games are available, 9-In-The-Air is a favorite of all ages, a gated playground is open for little ones, and the ample parking lot and grounds provide lots of space for kids of all ages to play. **Bring your lawn chair and take the night off!** All are welcome! West Grove United Methodist Church will be partnering with Good Works, a Christian nonprofit based in Coatesville, on Saturday, August 8th. This full day service opportunity will focus on home repair for one low-income homeowner in the greater Coatesville area. Good Works' vision is to eliminate substandard housing and replace hopeless with hope as people experience warmer, safer and drier homes. Good Works is the largest nonprofit in Chester County whose sole focus is to utilize volunteers to perform extensive repairs at no cost to the homeowners. Good Works workday staff, who are also volunteers, organize the work, plan for the needed materials, and accompany each group to the homes needing work. Applicants who have been approved by our agency receive repair services on their homes free of charge. Our slogan is "warmer, safer, drier" and our primary work involves repairs on windows, roof repair, plumbing repair and replacement of floor, walls, ceilings, etc. damaged by water or plumbing leaks. All tools and supplies are provided and our volunteers even teach people how to do what is needed! Workday staff remain in the home the entire time working beside the volunteers; you are never **left on your own** and there will always be someone to help you if you are unsure how to proceed. **Lunch will be provided** for you and the work continues after lunch, finishing usually around 4 p.m. Contact Melissa Jones at melissa jones@westgroveumc.org to sign up!

Meditations For Your Week

Sunday, July 19 ~ Saturday, July 25



SUNDAY: "Then Peter came and said to him, 'Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Matthew 18:21.

Prayerfully consider that the church is full of sinners seeking God's way. How is God using you, a sinner?

MONDAY: "Jesus said to him, 'Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times." Matthew 18:22.

God's forgiveness is immeasurable. Who do you need to forgive again?

- **TUESDAY:** "For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves." Matthew 18:23. Jesus used ordinary circumstances to describe the Kingdom of Heaven. Where do you see the Kingdom of Heaven breaking in around you?
- **WEDNESDAY:** "Should you not have had mercy on your fellow-slave, as I had mercy on you?" Matthew 18:33.

 God gives us a model of forgiveness and mercy. Ask God to help you today to forgive and offer mercy.
- **THURSDAY:** "Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice" Ephesians 4:31. Prayerfully ask God to help you let go of bitterness, wrath, wrangling, slander, and malice.
- **FRIDAY:** "And be kind to one another, tender-hearted" Ephesians 4:32a. How has your heart been tender today?
- **SATURDAY:** "Forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you." *Ephesians 4:32b.*

May God's forgiveness compel your forgiveness of others.
