

Old Testament Lesson: Colossians 3:12-17

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Gospel Lesson: John 8:1-11

Then each of them went home, while Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. Early in the morning he came again to the temple. All the people came to him and he sat down and began to teach them. The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery; and making her stand before all of them, they said to him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" They said this to test him, so that they might have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and wrote with his finger on the ground.

When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let anyone among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." And once again he bent down and wrote on the ground. When they heard it, they went away, one by one, beginning with the elders; and Jesus was left alone with the woman standing before him. Jesus straightened up and said to her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She said, "No one, sir." And Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go your way, and from now on do not sin again."

Radical Forgiveness

For the month of July, we are in series about radical forgiveness that God calls us to offer to others. Briefly, we have learned:

- Week 1: Forgiveness is not forgetting, but remembering and redeeming.
- Week 2: Forgiveness is a repeated act, that changes us into conduits of God's grace.
- Week 3: Forgiveness is not a feeling, but actions of reconciliation and justice
- Week 4: Forgiveness is ours to give away, because God in Christ gives it to us. Sermons are available from the office and on the website in written and audio form.

West Grove United Methodist Church will be partnering with Good Works, a Christian nonprofit based in Coatesville, on Saturday, August 8th. This full day service opportunity will focus on home repair for one low-income homeowner in the greater Coatesville area. Good Works workday staff, who are also volunteers, organize the work, plan for the needed materials, and accompany each group to the homes needing work. Applicants who have been approved by our agency receive repair services on their homes free of charge. All tools and supplies are provided and our volunteers even teach people how to do what is needed! Workday staff remain in the home the entire time working beside the volunteers; you are never left on your own and there will always be someone to help you if you are unsure how to proceed. Meditations For Your Week

Sunday, July 26 ~ Saturday, August 1



Sunday: "Early in the morning he came again to the temple. All the people came to him and he sat down and began to teach them." John 8:2.

Pause today to sit at the feet of Jesus and learn.

Monday: "Now in the law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?' John 8:5.

Jesus came to fulfill the law that we would more perfectly understand love.

Prayerfully consider how Jesus is calling us to live out such love in a world of law.

Tuesday: "When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, 'Let anyone among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." John 8:7.

Where is God calling you to put down stones?

Wednesday: "She said, 'No one, sir.' And Jesus said, 'Neither do I condemn you. Go your way, and from now on do not sin again." John 8:11.

Jesus is God's forgiveness. How are you living forgiveness?

Thursday: "As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience." Colossians 3:12.

Ask God to show you how to be dressed in compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience.

Friday: "Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive." Colossians 3:13.

Who is God calling you to forgive today?

Saturday: "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." Colossians 3:17.
