Old Testament Lesson: Psalm 34:1-8, 15-22

I will bless the Lord at all times; his praise shall continually be in my mouth. My soul makes its boast in the Lord; let the humble hear and be glad. O magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt his name together. I sought the Lord, and he answered me, and delivered me from all my fears. Look to him, and be radiant; so your faces shall never be ashamed. This poor soul cried, and was heard by the Lord, and was saved from every trouble. The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear him, and delivers them. O taste and see that the Lord is good; happy are those who take refuge in him.

The eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their cry. The face of the Lord is against evildoers, to cut off the remembrance of them from the earth. When the righteous cry for help, the Lord hears, and rescues them from all their troubles. The Lord is near to the brokenhearted, and saves the crushed in spirit. Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the Lord rescues them from them all. He keeps all their bones; not one of them will be broken. Evil brings death to the wicked, and those who hate the righteous will be condemned. The Lord redeems the life of his servants; none of those who take refuge in him will be condemned.

Old Testament Lesson: Exodus 14:5-14

When the king of Egypt was told that the people had fled, the minds of Pharaoh and his officials were changed toward the people, and they said, "What have we done, letting Israel leave our service?" So he had his chariot made ready, and took his army with him; he took six hundred picked chariots and all the other chariots of Egypt with officers over all of them. The Lord hardened the heart of Pharaoh king of Egypt and he pursued the Israelites, who were going out boldly. The Egyptians pursued them, all Pharaoh's horses and chariots, his chariot drivers and his army; they overtook them camped by the sea, by Pi-hahiroth, in front of Baalzephon. As Pharaoh drew near, the Israelites looked back, and there were the Egyptians advancing on them. In great fear the Israelites cried out to the Lord. They said to Moses, "Was it because there were no graves in Egypt that you have taken us away to die in the wilderness? What have you done to us, bringing us out of Egypt? Is this not the very thing we told you in Egypt, "Let us alone and let us serve the Egyptians'? For it would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than to die in the wilderness." But Moses said to the people, "Do not be afraid, stand firm, and see the deliverance that the Lord will accomplish for you today; for the Egyptians whom you see today you shall never see again. The Lord will fight for you, and you have only to keep still."

Sunday, August 9 ~ Saturday, August 15



**Sunday:** "I will bless the Lord at all times; his praise shall continually be in my mouth." Psalm 34:1. Take a moment to tell someone else how God has been kind to you.

**Monday:** "I sought the Lord, and he answered me, and delivered me from all my fears." Psalm 34:4. God is near to us. Lean on God in times of fear today.

**Tuesday:** "The eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their cry." Psalm 34:15. Prayerfully consider sharing your needs and worries with God as you draw nearer to God.

**Wednesday:** "The Lord is near to the broken-hearted, and saves the crushed in spirit." Psalm 34:18. Where do you need to share this message with someone else today?

**Thursday:** "The Israelites said to Moses, 'Was it because there were no graves in Egypt that you have taken us away to die in the wilderness? What have you done to us, bringing us out of Egypt?" Exodus 14:11. When we feel abandoned, we imagine the worst of God as the Israelites did. God still took the Israelites to the Promised Land. Where do you need to have faith that God is leading you to the Promised Land?

**Friday:** "But Moses said to the people, 'Do not be afraid, stand firm, and see the deliverance that the Lord will accomplish for you today'" Exodus 14:13a. In prayer, ask God to help you stand firm!

**Saturday:** "The Lord will fight for you, and you have only to keep still." Exodus 14:14. Pause in the presence of God as God works for your good!
