Whenever I have to go to any new place, I need to know what roads to take but since I have GPS, I don't have to study the map before each trip. I can just type the address into the GPS and it can find the directions on how to get me to my destination. The only thing I have to do is to follow the directions that the GPS gives me. The GPS tells me when and where to turn. It tells me exactly how many miles are left to the destination and the time of arrival.

A couple years ago when I went to see my brother, I entered the address of my brother's house into the GPS and I just followed the directions according to GPS. Then I realized that instead of leading me to Goethals Bridge and later to Verrazano Bridge to cross into Staten Island to take Belt Parkway and Southern State Parkway to my brother's house, the GPS instead directed me to take Holland Tunnel and cross into downtown Manhattan to take the Long Island Expressway. Immediately, I said to myself "there is always a lot of traffic in Manhattan and as I used to cross the Goethals Bridge when I was working in Staten Island, NY, I thought to myself that it might be the best route." With that in my mind, I disobeyed how the GPS told me to go and I took exit 13 of New Jersey Turnpike. After few minutes of driving, I realized that there was a traffic jam. It was not moving at all. I stayed almost 20 minutes in the midst of slow moving traffic. I realized that my GPS had MSN Direct which transmits real time traffic, weather, and local gas price data to the GPS. So my GPS knew that there was a traffic jam on Goethals Bridge and also throughout the Staten Island Expressway. Finally, I listened to my GPS and got out from that traffic jam and I had to take the New Jersey Turnpike again later to take Holland Tunnel.

How many times don't we realize that our sources are limited and we cannot predict what can happen in our future? However, our God knows what will happen in our future if we keep doing what we are doing, so sometimes God wants to take us on a different route, not the one we used to take and the route we think that is the best: not Goethals Bridge this time, but the Holland Tunnel.

How many times have we not listened to God's directions?

So my question is "are we carefully listening God's voice and directions in our life or are we doing what we used to do all the time and take the directions we think are the best? As it is not only important to buy the GPS but also it is important to listen to what the GPS tells us, it is not only important to pray, study the word of God and be connected with God, but to listen and follow God's direction even though it is not the way we used to travel. My travel experience gave me a lesson and made me think that it is very important to listen to God's small voice and follow it even though it might not seem right for me.

In 2014, let us carefully listen to God's voice and follow God's directions.

TRUSTEES: 2013 in Review

- A Children's Morning Out guidelines document and Committee was adopted by the Trustees and Ad Council in an effort to improve and move the CMO Preschool Ministry forward. We want to see it continue to succeed.
- Used, donated material to build a secure storage area for our Memory Bells Choir bells. Thanks to Ralph Curtiss for his leadership in design and construction.
- In February, we held a "Book Sale" and raised \$495 toward the budget. Darlene Murphy deserves credit for this successful event.
- The trustees are thankful that Linda Shiplet and Brenda Rogers have successfully received their food handlers licenses. Joe Dea has offered to get his license also. We have voted to reimburse these 3 and hope to keep at least three at all times.
- We have, along with Ad Council, agreed to charter Boy Scout Troop 12. They meet in our youth rooms on Thursday evenings. The boys of the troop gave enthusiastic assistance at the church Strawberry Picnic in June and also at the Chicken BBQ in September.
- A flat-screen monitor was installed in the sanctuary. The purpose was to prevent distraction in the order of worship when a video presentation was used to enhance a sermon or other worship elements.
- Dante Carpeting replaced the carpets in rooms 9 and 12 as well as the copy room, due to wrinkling and becoming a safety issue.
- In November and December, another safety issue made the replacement of our kitchen stove a priority. We appreciate the generous donations that made it possible to pay for the stove and its installation by 12/31/13.
- Led by Linda Shiplet's tireless efforts, we had a very successful Chicken BBQ. All those who helped this event succeed deserve the Trustee Board's gratitude and thanks. 10% of the profits were set aside for local mission use. Also, another 10% of the profits were provided to Boy Scout Troop 12 for their help. The remainder will be used by the Trustees for capital improvement projects in 2014.
- The Chester County Health Department requires a canopy over the BBQ pit and one has been purchased and enlarged. It will also provide shade during the church picnic in June.
- Gene Aucott found 2 cabinets in an office restoration project and has converted them into moveable book carts for our sanctuary. Our first chance to use them was the 1/12/14 service at 11 a.m. Using them will save our hymnals and bibles from being damaged and needing expensive replacement.

Our main goal in 2014 is to keep our operating expenses below \$53,000 and including our \$60,000 mortgage commitment, to not exceed \$113,000 total. More importantly, we want to provide an inviting, well kept building where others can find Christ and we have a place to corporately give our thanks and praise to Him. It will also give us a place to prepare us to spread the good news throughout "Judea, Samaria and the World."

Finance Report for 2013

BUDGETTEREPORT As a Church family, we are truly blessed with good stewardship in terms of tithes and offerings. Our expenses for 2013 were \$350,439 versus an overall income of \$344,552, resulting in a negative variance of \$5,887.

As part of our commitment to the conference's Retired Pastors Fund, we donated \$8,000 to "Fulfilling" Our Covenant" through monies from the Harvest fund that Missions generously released for use in meeting this obligation. If we had not made this substantial payment, we would have ended the year with a positive increase in the general fund of \$2,113. Additionally, we donated \$1,966 to UMCOR for the Philippines disaster relief from our Thanksgiving collection. By sending in these two payments in the 2013 calendar year, we will receive a credit on our 2015 UMC apportionments thereby reducing this obligation in 2015.

With our many outreach and mission activities, we continue to make a difference. Take a moment to reflect upon and celebrate your contribution to the work of the Church, through your stewardship of financial resources, time, and talents. Additionally, celebrate the collective efforts of our Church family. Many wonderful activities are supported during the year by your donations.
