




Worship Begins Sunday, June 8 at 9:30 a.m.

- 4. Show love, respect, and even grief, for your departing pastor. This is one of the best things you can do for the new pastor.
- 5. Find appropriate occasions to thank Pastor BK.

Continue to welcome Pastor Monica in the first few weeks.

- 10. Give a gift certificate to several of your favorite restaurants in the community.
- 11. Invite Pastor Monica to any social event held by Sunday school classes or other groups in the early months.
- 12. Make sure Pastor Monica's husband, Steve, is invited to Sunday School and other appropriate small groups.
- 13. Continue to remember Pastor Monica and her family in your daily prayers.

- 14. Introduce yourself Pastor Monica repeatedly! You have one name to learn, she has many names to learn.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace and Peace to You from God, Our Creator, Jesus Christ, Our Lord, and the Holy Spirit! I know that many prayers have gone before our time of ministry together. her pastor after a deadly explosion in a nearby town killed 361 men.

Soon after, Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington, wanted to show her gratitude to her father, who'd cared for the family after his wife died. Dodd asked her pastor to choose a June Sunday to honor all fathers, and he selected June 19, 1910.

In 1924, President Coolidge suggested that Father's Day become a national holiday. In 1966, President Johnson designated the third Sunday of June to be Father's Day. Six years later, President Nixon instituted Father's Day as a national observance.

CMO'S LABELS FOR EDUCATION PROGRAM!



After a year of grief, I've learned a lot. I've also made some mistakes along the way. Today, I jotted down 15 things I wish I'd known about grief when I started my own process. I pass this onto anyone on the journey.





- **3. Grief comes in waves.** You might be okay one hour, not okay the next. Okay one day, not okay the next day. Okay one month, not okay the next. Learn to go with the flow of what your heart and mind are feeling.
- **4.** It's okay to cry. Do it often. But it's okay to laugh, too. Don't feel guilty for feeling positive emotions even when dealing with loss.
- **5. Take care of yourself, even if you don't feel like it.** Eat healthily. Work out. Do the things you love. Remember that you are still living.
- **6. Don't shut people out.** Don't cut yourself off from relationships. You will hurt yourself and others.
- 7. No one will respond perfectly to your grief. People-even people you love-will let you down. Friends you thought would be there won't be there, and people you hardly know will reach out. Be prepared to give others grace. Be prepared to work through hurt and forgiveness at others' reactions.





8. God will be there for you perfectly. He will never, ever let you

down. He will let you scream, cry, and question. Throw all your emotions at Him. He is near to the brokenhearted.

9. Take time to truly remember the person you lost. Write about him or her, go back to all your memories with them, truly soak in all the good times

you had with that person. It will help.

- **10.** Facing the grief is better than running. Don't hide from the pain. If you do, it will fester and grow and consume you.
- 11. You will ask "Why?" more times than you thought possible, but you may never get an answer. What helps is asking, "How? How can I live life more fully to honor my loved one? How can I love better, how can I embrace others, how can I change and grow because of this?"
- **12.** You will try to escape grief by getting too busy, busy, busy. You will think that if you don't think about it, it'll just go away. This isn't really true. Take time to process and heal.
- 13. Liquor, sex, drugs, hobbies, work, relationships, etc., will not take the pain away. If you are using anything to try and numb the pain, it will make things worse in the long run. Seek help if you're dealing with the sorrow in unhealthy ways.
- **14.** It's okay to ask for help. It's okay to need people. It's okay, it's okay, it's okay.
- **15. Grief can be beautiful and deep and profound.** Don't be afraid of it. Walk alongside it. You may be surprised at what grief can teach you.


THE WEST GROVE UMC ENDOWMENT FUND






