You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which will produce thanksgiving to God through us; for the rendering of this ministry not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God."
 2 Corinthians 9:10-12

Years ago when our American nation was organizing, there were many important decisions to be made as to how our country would be systematized and symbolized. As they were all worked out, one debate raged on – the National bird. While the eagle was the popular favorite, another voice advocated for the turkey. Benjamin Franklin argued for the turkey as the all-American bird, while ultimately the bald eagle won the contest handily.

I remember this debate as we come to thanksgiving and the turkey. Consider some of the comparisons:

Turkeys can grow to 86 pounds and 3,500 feathers. Eagles weigh about 15 pounds with over 7,000 feathers. You could say the turkey is more substance and the eagle is more fluff.



Turkeys have a rhythmic gobble, and the eagle has a high-pitched shrill.

Turkeys can run up to 25 miles an hour; eagles do not run, they soar.

The average American consumes 19 pounds of turkey annually; it is a felony to eat an eagle.

Further, the turkey is defined as "a large bird raised for food." The turkey exists **for** others. The eagle is defined as "a large bird of prey." The eagle exists **because** of others.

As we come to this time of giving thanks, we remember that we too are called to exist **for** others, not **because** of others. We give generously, so that the word of God may be spread and the actions of God might be known here and around the world. Paul's letter to the church at Corinth is an encouragement to each of us that even as we give of ourselves **for** others, God supplies our needs. So, in this time of thanks and giving, we follow the ways of Jesus and the inspiration of the turkey.

Throughout this month, prayerfully consider how you might give thanks to God for your blessings and make an offering **for** others.

- * Give food to our Sukkot booth to feed the hungry in our community (see details on page 8).
- * Give coats and blankets for those without in our community (see details on page 9).
- * Give to children around the world through Operation Christmas Child (see details on page 13).
- * Commit to giving next year through a commitment card with your prayers, presence, gifts, talents, and witness. Additional cards available in the Narthex.
- * Invite someone to Thanksgiving Dinner who might be without company or good food.


- September 27th, 2014- Pastor Jim offered the invocation and benediction at Penn Township Day.

DS DAWN TAYLOR-STORM ANNOUNCES SOUTHEAST DISTRICT MISSION PROJECT



Southeast District Global Mission Project: Building a Pediatric Unit for the Mpsa Medical Clinic in the Congo **Southeast District Goal: \$50,000**

Background: Congo is the third largest African Country and is surrounded by nine other nations in which there is often suffering. Our primary outreach in the Congo is through the Mpsa Medical and Nutrition Clinic, located about 20 miles from the nation's capital of Kinshasa. Our clinic, currently directed by Dr. Rebecca Yohadi provides vital medical services to this community. We also sponsor a nutrition program for children and their families. About 300 children a day come for food, five days a week. The partnership supports the salaries of the doctors, nurses, and nutrition staff, along with the food, medical supplies, and equipment.

Southeast District Focus: Building a Pediatric Unit (COST: \$50,000)

One of our great hopes is to be able to build a separate Pediatric Wing to the hospital. ***There are currently beds for only 25 patients. When children are ill, they must be put in with adults, who often have more serious infections.*** Land has been recently purchased that adjoined the property. All that is needed is funding for the building. ***Once the building is in place, we will have a dedication ceremony and will be seeking representatives from the Southeast District to attend and dedicate the building. The hope is that this will be completed in 2016. Please pray about this initiative, educate your congregation about the need, and then seek support! Let us do our part and be as generous as possible.



The word Sukkot is the plural of the Hebrew word *sukkah*, meaning booth or hut. During this holiday, Jews are instructed to construct a temporary structure in which to eat their meals, entertain guests, relax, and even sleep. The *sukkah* is intended to reflect God's benevolence in providing for all the Jews' needs in the desert.

The sukkah is a temporary building used for meals throughout the holiday. It can be built of any materials, but its roof must be of organic material and partially open to the sky. The decor of the interior of the sukkah may range from totally unornamented to lavishly decorated.


