Created to be Generous

"Then God said, "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness." Genesis 1:26a

Have you ever watched children play? Depending on their developmental age, they range the gambit from "it's mine" to parallel play to "Can I show these neat toys?" Playing together in the neighborhood cul-de-sac is as likely to produce conflict over one scooter, as it is to demonstrate a new game in which everyone takes a timed turn riding from here to there to compare speed. On the playground, different ages will compete for the same swings

and others will find a balance between the basketball net and the open space.

I often discover that watching children gives us an unvarnished look at our lives as well. Adults are as disparate in their interactions as children are. Some adults are natural being generous as children are sharing. They hear needs and contribute amply. Their words lift up the best in others. Their actions seem to inspire others. Other adults are motivated by maintaining their own resources. Their words speak frustration. Their actions are not helpful.

God created people in the very image of God. God's compassion and mercy, justice and love, peace and generosity are a part of our very DNA. Scientists are working hard to confirm these biblical and spiritual inspirations. We are created to be the image of God. Again and again in scripture, we see God's generosity. Generosity of mercy and grace, generosity of compassion and justice, generosity of resources and time. Generous is who God has created us to be!

However, if we are honest, many of us see ourselves in all of the developmental stages of children. There are times when we call out, "it's mine!" Times when we would rather just watch what is unfolding (parallel play). And prayerfully, times in which we share our very prized possessions with others. However, we all seek to live more fully as God created us to live.

When you are not living into who God has called you to be, you show signs of discontent. We are grumpy and uncomfortable. We are worried about how we will make ends meet. Scarcity drives our conversation. We are not listening to how God might be calling us to share our resources so that others might know the hand of God. God does not speak the language of scarcity. God instead creates out of abundance, and particularly out of our abundance.

This fall, as we watch pumpkins appear in abundance from our decorations to our coffee, let us also recall our own creation. God has created us to be generous and to be the hands and feet of God here on earth.




October 4 - Technology Fun: Join us as we look at a movie clip and spend time



COLOR ME CALM

Have you ever watched children color in their favorite coloring books? They pick out colors, one at a time, marking the page, tracing lines, slowly filling in the picture, bringing it to life. They're often so peaceful and at ease. Why can't adults have that too? It turns out they can, and they should! Adult coloring books are rising in popularity as stressed out folks find peace of mind inside the lines. The slow, deliberate coloring of shapes and pictures involves both logic and creativity, which

in turn induces relaxation by repressing the activity of the amygdala, a part of the brain that controls stress-related emotions. Taking time to unwind creatively has the potential to reduce stress by channeling it into the colors on a page.

Art therapy has often taken the form of crafts, music, or free-form drawing, but there's something to be said to coloring inside the lines. Simply speaking, the act of concentrating on coloring a design greatly reduces your focus on anything worrisome. Just think: as a kid, were you ever worried about anything while you colored? Of course not!

Especially in this digital age, it's helpful to take your eyes off the screen and zone out into a beautiful lined canvas of a garden, a country scene, or even a whimsical cat, just waiting to be splashed with color. And who doesn't love to color?


