This fall, our aloe plant needed to be repotted. This plant had travelled with Steve and I for the last eleven years. It had been broken off and used as needed. It had seen seasons of high attention and use. It had seen seasons of low attention, low use, and perhaps, low watering. It needed a new start. So, I found a pot from our garage and repotted it. I watered it regularly and keep it in a spot with some sunlight. We have used a few times since the fall, but in general, I rarely look at it, except to water it.

Imagine my surprise when three weeks ago, I notice some non-aloe leaves coming up in the pot alongside the hardy aloe plant. I asked Steve and the children if they had dropped any seeds in the pot—no one had. So, after deciding to give the leaves an opportunity to show themselves, we watched with delight as a purple hyacinth peeked out from between the verdant leaves. It seems that the pot I found was an Easter gift from a previous year that retained bulbs in the soil. I wonder what other signs of spring will surprise us over the next couple of weeks.

As I have watched this plant, I have also thought about what God does with us, as individuals and as a church. Do we not have times when we feel broken off and used, like my hardy aloe plant? Are there not times when we are very attentive to God and other times when we almost forget about God? Do we not need a new start, from time to time?

God continues to surprise us! The scripture verse at the top of the page is the prophet Isaiah speaking God's words to God's people, from thousands of years ago to today.

GOD IS ABOUT TO DO A NEW THING!

Whether your Lent has been reflective and restorative or another day of trying to keep up, consider that God may still surprise you with God's presence. God shows up in the most surprising places. Do you perceive it? Look around! Listen closely! God is near. Let us draw near, again, to God.

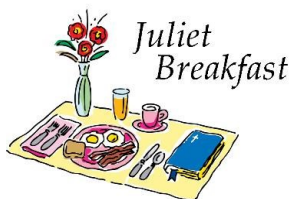

8 Things You Should Never Use Past Their Expiration Date

When in doubt, throw it out. With the advent of multiple cases of salmonella, listeria, and other food-borne bacteria can cause serious illness or even death. Remember sell by dates are not necessarily the same as expiration dates.

Mixed Greens

Mixed greens and bagged salad mixes have a tendency to carry certain bacteria associated with poor sanitation because they are handled so frequently. Mixed greens also get a dark, slimy appearance as they expire.

Fresh Berries

Fresh berries can carry a parasite called cyclospora. Always wash berries thoroughly before consuming them and don't use them past their expiration date or once they begin to breakdown.

Deli Meats

Deli meat should never be consumed past its expiration date, even if it hasn't developed a strange odor or slimy appearance; it can carry listeria, bacteria that can grow in cold temperatures. That means listeria can thrive even if your deli meat has been properly stored in the refrigerator.

Eggs

The chance of an egg being contaminated inside the shell are very low but egg shells commonly carry bacteria. If your eggs have passed their expiration date it's best to either toss them or use them for hard-boiled eggs.

Ground Meats

Ground meats are generally more dangerous to consume post-expiration date when compared with whole cuts of meat; ground meats are handled more (including the grinding process) and may include meat from many different slaughterhouses - all this adds up to more opportunities for contamination.

Soft Cheese

Soft cheeses (especially those made with unpasteurized milk) can be contaminated with listeria. With soft cheeses it's difficult to effectively trim away any moldy or spoiled portions. If soft cheeses like queso fresco, feta, brie, or blue are past their expiration date it's best to throw them away.

Alfafa Sprouts

Alfafa sprouts can be dangerous to consume after their expiration date as well. The sprouts need a warm, moist environment to grow, the same environment bacteria needs to thrive. Since sprouts are most often eaten raw, it's difficult to eliminate any bacteria that may be present.

Raw Chicken

Consumer Reports tested 300 store-bought chicken breasts for bacteria; 97% of the chicken breasts were contaminated---not surprising given the conditions under which chickens are raised, and rising nationwide concerns about antibiotic-resistant bacteria. If your chicken is past its expiration date, toss it!

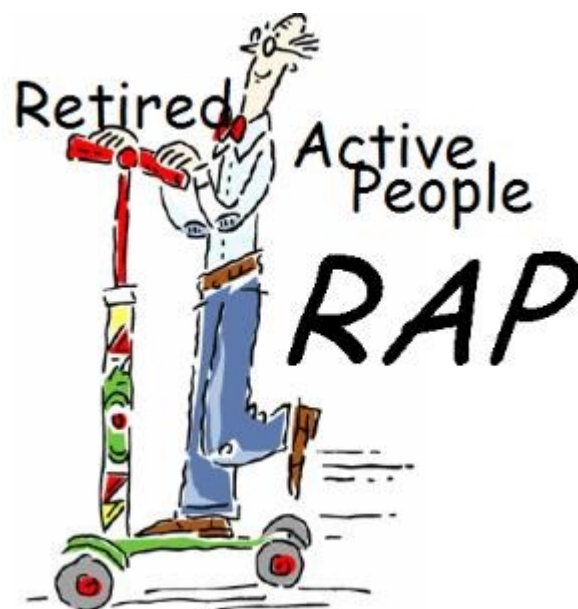

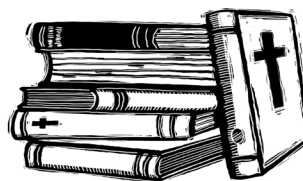

OPERATION HOPE TOTE

Once again, it's time for our annual participation in Operation Hope Tote. Look for Operation Hope Tote envelopes in the lobby. **They will be collected during March and all items should be returned to the church by Sunday, March 30, 2014.**

This project is part of the Sunday Breakfast Mission's Christian outreach program that helps struggling, homeless men in the Wilmington, DE, area. For many years, the Sunday Breakfast Mission has been distributing these totes during Easter week. West Grove United Methodist Church has been part of this Easter project for several years.



Hope Totes are small plastic bags that are provided by the Sunday Breakfast Mission, and our congregation has been filling them with new, unopened products, including: toothbrush and toothpaste, soap, shaving cream, shampoo and conditioner, deodorant, lip balm, socks, brush and comb, tissues, shoelaces, hand or body lotion, disposable razors, mouthwash, etc. The filled bags are then delivered to the Sunday Breakfast Mission and distributed as needed.

These basic supplies can make a big difference in the way people who are homeless live and feel about themselves.



The Hope Totes are available in the narthex of the church. **Please take as many as you like and return the filled Totes to the church by March 30.**

Operation Hope Tote is a simple but powerful way to help homeless people and to express Christ's love and the spirit of renewal that is such an important part of Easter. Thank you for your help in this very worthwhile project.
