"Every day to us is Easter, with its resurrection song. When in trouble, move the faster to our God who rights the wrong. Alleluia! Alleluia! See the power of heavenly throngs!"

There are so many gems hidden in plain sight in our United Methodist hymnal. Every so often, I find myself reading the words, pounding out the melodies on the piano, and looking into the stories behind the hymn. The hymn, "Easter People Raise Your Voices", includes the invitation to celebrate the resurrection of Christ today and every day. Rev. William James wrote those words for his congregation in Harlem when his people needed to remember on Easter (and throughout the year) that God is in control. His people had experienced the drudgeries of life and needed to know God will be victorious. Perhaps, you and I need to remember this - that every day is Easter as well. I invite you to take a moment to read over the full of the hymn in our hymnal, number 304.

It was on the first morning, when the story of redemption and resurrection had not yet been trumpeted to the world that the disciples sought Jesus out of sadness and despair, commitment and obligation. Hear the witness of the disciples from Luke 24:1-12:

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again.' Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.

The first Easter morning is so much like the church today. In the church today, we have those who like the women share the witness of Christ with some fear and trembling. There are those who dismiss the words and experiences of others as idle tales. There are some who believe upon hearing, and there are some like Peter, who must see for themselves. However you have heard the words of Christ, hold them near to your heart and then offer the good news to others. Every day for us is Easter, and God still rights the wrongs. This is the good news! So, come rejoicing on this Sunday as we celebrate Easter and many Sundays to follow as we celebrate and share God's hope in and with a challenging world.

Risen Christ, you indeed right the wrongs and bring the good news! On Easter and beyond, soften our hearts to hear your message as we seek to serve you with our lives, In the name of the One who was, is, and will be, Amen.





How can you help?

This is a biannual event pioneered by the United Methodist Women. It offers gently used clothing and household items to the community at record low prices. Many families in our community attend this event and the bargains are very helpful to them in these hard economic times. In order for the event to be held, many hands are needed for the physical labor of setting up the sanctuary and putting the items out on tables on the Thursday before the Friday sale. Then the reverse must happen on Saturday to get the sanctuary set up for Sunday worship. It is also helpful to have a half dozen people available during the busiest sale hours to help with check out on Friday and Saturday morning. Please consider lending an hour or two. The United Methodist Women use the proceeds of this event for various missions or additions to our church.

Also needed, of course, are donations of gently used clothing and household items. These can be brought to the church during office hours the week before the sale.



THE POWER AND THE GLORY

This June, after a five year absence, Hopewell UMC's Drama Ministry will present **THE POWER AND THE GLORY--**the modern language resetting of their original **Passion Play**. This wonderfully rich telling of the story of Jesus' ministry, teachings, sacrifice, victory, resurrection, and ascension was originally translated in 2005 from **The Passion Play** which was first performed at Hopewell in 1963. This newer production is based on the earlier script, bringing the King James Version of The Bible's language into contemporary language using several Biblical translations and adding several scenes to tell more of "the greatest story ever told".

The beginning production was performed indoors and was so popular it became an annual event. The first outdoor performance was held in 1966 with the audience sitting on folding chairs. Their outdoor amphitheater now contains 900 comfortable, convenient, and permanent stadium seats. There have been as many as 400 people involved in this

annual presentation. The performances are in June because of the seasonal weather. In case of rain, the play is held inside. Admission to the play is free. Freewill offerings are gratefully received.

- **1.** You know what makes me feel safe, secure, and happy? A smile.
- **2.** Did you ever consider this? When you get tense and uptight it makes me feel tense and uptight.
- **3.** Please try to understand and remember it is my short term memory, my right now memory, that is gone---don't talk so fast, or use so many words.
- 4. Slow down. And don't sneak up on me and start talking. Did I tell you I like smiles?
- **5.** Make sure you have my attention before you start blabbering away. What is going to happen if you start blabbering away and you don't have my attention, or confuse me? I am going to say NO- count on it.
- **6.** My attention span and ability to pay attention are not as good as they once were, Please make eye contact with me before you start talking. A nice smile always gets my attention. Did I mention that before?
- **7.** You talk too much--instead try taking my hand and leading the way. I need a guide not a person to nag me all the time

Where does the sodium in our diet come from? 5% is added during cooking 6% is added at the table 12% occurs naturally 77% is in processed or prepared foods

High Sodium Foods:

Bacon, Canned vegetables, Ham, Packaged deli meats, Ramen noodles, Bouillon cubes or broth, Cheese, Hot dogs, Pickles, Salad dressings, Boxed rice and noodle dish, Cheese puffs, Ketchup, Potato chips, Salted nuts, Breakfast cereals, Canned soups, Frozen dinners, Marinades, Pretzels, Sausage, Gravy, Olives, Processed Cheese.

To reduce your sodium intake, try these tips:

• Use herbs and spices to flavor foods. Try fresh herbs, spices, vinegar, and citrus to season your foods instead of reaching for the saltshaker.

SALT



• Choose fresh foods over processed foods. Fresh fruits, vegetables, and meats are naturally lower in sodium than canned or processed foods.

• Prepare your own foods. Restaurant and convenience foods typically have a lot of salt. When you cook your own food, you control how much salt you add.

- Choose low-sodium canned goods. If you buy processed foods, check the label and pick foods with the lowest level of sodium.
- Limit foods with more than 200 mg of sodium per serving, Read the Nutrition Facts label for the serving size and consider how many servings you actually eat.
- Quite simply USE LESS SALT. Gradually cut back on the amount of salt you add to your food. Your taste buds will adjust and you may even prefer less salt.



Susannah Wesley Education and Health center

This drainer was installed as part of Susannah Wesley ministry to help the community around. Also we have resumed repairing work the dis-pensary. Both work are still in progress.

Sewing training courses have started. They are four students cur-rently enrolled in this intake. They will be finishing in in April.

Other news and activities

During the visit to USA end last year, Mrs. Kalangwa was selling DVDs of Shalom choir (our main choir at Morogoro United Methodist Church) which was part of funds raising. We thank God for all those who bought those DVDs, we hope you were blessed by the songs. We are happy to announce that the money raised has helped us to buy a set of musical instruments which were presented in church on Sunday 15th February 2015.

On the first Sunday of this month, our local pastor and mission-ary Ngoy Kalangwa visited the Mangae village for supervision and strengthening the church. They have discovered some chal-

lenges faced by people from Mangae. One of them is water. These Masai people from



Mangae depend on water from the river nearby. But this river has been dangerous for them as there are crocodiles which have been threatening their lives. Last month, they lost a six years old boy who was eaten by croco-diles. And recently a 24 years old woman was rescued from the attack of a crocodile. The church in Morogoro wants to be in-volved in assisting their fellow members in Mangae to reduce the danger by digging a public well.



The missions team of West Grove UMC in conjunction with Family Promise of Southern Chester County is **evaluating** the possibility of being a host church for homeless families in Southern Chester County.

A host church provides overnight accommodations for up to five families / 14 people for a one week period (Sunday evening to the following Sunday morning) every 3 months. These carefully screened families are provided shelter, meals, and support services to help them get back into housing with a goal period of 30 days.

Family Promise has a day center that is located in downtown West Grove on Evergreen Street, where the families are able to shower and receive support services for getting back on their feet.

A host church provides:

Sleeping accommodations ;A living area / hospitality room

A Dining area; Evening Meals; Simple Breakfasts; Bag lunches

Compassion and hospitality

Overnight Volunteers (14); Set-up / Take-Down (2-4)
