"That precious memory triggers another: your honest faith—and what a rich faith it is, handed down from your grandmother Lois to your mother Eunice, and now to you! And the special gift of ministry you received when I laid hands on you and prayed keep that ablaze! God doesn't want us to be shy with his gifts, but bold and loving and sensible. " 2 Timothy 1:5, The Message

In March, there was a headline in the Religious News Service that caught my eye, **"College freshmen less religious than ev-er — just like their parents**." As I went onto to read the arti-

cle, I learned that Over a quarter of college freshmen say that they have no religion. This makes them the least religious cohort in four decades of the surveys conducted by UCLA. The survey, not only asks about the student, but also about their parents—what is the religion or religious practices of their parent? The highest rise for both parents and students was in "none" as in answering the question, "Which religion do you practice?" (<u>http://tobingrant.religionnews.com/2015/03/17/college-freshmen-less-religious-ever-just-like-parents/</u>)

I was not surprised by the decline in religious practice or faith connection; this is an ongoing story with multiple motivations. I was surprised by the tagline, "just like their parents." The connection between parents who had no connection with religion and young adults who grow to find no value in religion stands in the face of parents who imagine that there children will develop their faith, or lack thereof, on their own. Parents who are religious are more likely to have children who find value in a faith-filled life.

With Mother's day and Father's day on the horizon, I find myself giving thanks for my father, who modeled a faithful life, even in the midst of doubts and questions. I give thanks for my mother, who is still living out her faith and looking for new ways to serve. I give thanks to God for my maternal grand-parents who were so convinced that I was called to the ministry that they started having me meet female pastors starting when I was twelve. Felicity and Peter both have their middle names, Olive and David, from these great examples in the faith. I give thanks to God for my paternal grandparents whose lives were shaped and shaken by their roles in World War II as liberator and one who was liberated, and who sought to address those shaping experiences all of the rest of their lives through faith.

In Paul's letter to Timothy, he commends the roles of his mother and grandmother in shaping Timothy. The sharing of our faith, the living of our faith, the passing down of our faith are essential to the discipleship of all and the bringing forth of the Kingdom of God. The examples we give to our children, our grandchildren, our nieces and nephews, our neighbors and our church family matter. When we live in such a way that our faith matters, those who are growing up and looking our way are more likely to live in such a way that their faith matters, too.

Who can you give thanks to God for? Who has shaped you in the faith? Who is looking up at you, deciding how they will live out their faith or lack thereof?


Happy Prayer for Mother's Day





This June, after a five year absence, Hopewell UMC's Drama Ministry will present **THE POWER AND THE GLORY--**the modern language resetting of their original **Passion Play**. This wonderfully rich telling of the story of Jesus' ministry, teachings, sacrifice, victory, resurrection, and ascension was originally translated in 2005 from **The Passion Play** which was first performed at Hopewell in 1963. This newer production is based on the earlier script, bringing the King James Version of The Bible's language into contemporary language using several Biblical translations and adding several scenes to tell more of "the greatest story ever told".

The beginning production was performed indoors and was so popular it became an annual event. The first outdoor performance was held in 1966 with the audience sitting on folding chairs. Their outdoor amphitheater now contains 900 comfortable, convenient, and permanent stadium seats. There have been as many as 400 people involved in this annual presentation. The performances are in June because of the seasonal weather. In case of rain, the play is held inside. Admission to the play is free. Freewill offerings are gratefully received.

Annual Conference What Is It?


On May 14-16, Pastor Monica, Pastor Jim, Cindy Haley, and Luke Chalmers will attend the Eastern Pennsylvania Annual Conference.

What is Annual Conference? For United Methodists, Annual Conference is both a

yearly meeting and the name of our geographical boundaries. There are 463 churches in the eastern part of the state, from Philadelphia to the Poconos and the Delaware River to Lebanon County, that comprise the Eastern Pennsylvania Annual Conference. Throughout the country, we have 63 annual conferences, encompassing all 50 states. There are also United Methodists in 163 countries – the world is our parish, as our founder John Wesley stated 250 years ago!

Our yearly gathering of clergy and lay people from the 463 churches in our area is also known as Annual Conference. This year, the Conference is held at the Greater Philadelphia Expo Center, Oaks, PA. The theme this year for our annual conference is "Faithful Stewardship of Our Time, Treasure and Environment." The Keynote Presenter will be The Rev. Dr. Clif Christopher, who founded the Horizons Stewardship Company in 1992. Both in his local church ministry and stewardship ministry, he led numerous major building, capital campaigns, and consultations in over 1,000 churches, conferences, synods and diocese in all phases of building, finance, and church growth. We will also be blessed by the prophetic messages of **The Rev.** Dr. Susan Henry-Crowe, General Secretary of The United Methodist General Board of Church & Society (GBCS). As the chief executive officer of the board, Dr. Henry-Crowe leads GBCS's visionary role as the denomination's social-justice advocate and oversees programming, staff and administration of the board's office, headquartered in Washington, D.C.

More than 1000 United Methodists – half lay, half clergy – will gather to approve legislation and new rules governing our life together, be inspired by gifted teachers and preachers, receive reports on the work that United Methodists take part in, and recognize pastors who are retiring or who have passed away and celebrate the ordination of new pastors. Please keep Pastor Monica, Pastor Jim, Cindy Haley, and Luke Chalmers in your prayers along with our other brothers and sisters as we seek God's direction and guidance for us and God's people in Eastern Pennsylvania!
