"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, "Hebrew 12: 1-2a

It was during the Great Depression that comics in the form that we are familiar arrived. Superman, Batman, Captain America, and Wonder Woman all debuted starting in 1935. In our faith, we know one as above all the rest: Jesus the Christ! Superhero to the superheroes! This year's VBS invites us to meet Jesus as a superhero! To see the Bible as a comic book of adventures and exploits to be emulated. To know Jesus as a personal superhero ready to be in all of our adventures throughout our lives.



In order for children and youth to know the most incredible superhero of all time, we need you! You may not be able to smash like the Hulk or fly an invisible plane like Wonder Woman or have webs shoot out of your wrist like Spiderman. But you, too can be a superhero. A superhero of registering children for VBS, a superhero of handing out snacks, a superhero of traveling with a class. A superhero of pointing to God every day of VBS as children, youth, and other adults begin to imagine Jesus as their own personal superhero!

Each and every time, we baptize someone in the faith, the congregation makes a promise to "nurture one another in the Christian faith and life and include these persons now before you in your care." We promise to teach Sunday School and count offerings; we promise to lead bible studies and fix leaky toilets. We promise to do everything we can, so that children of God will know God more. We promise to be superheroes to those who need to see God with capes and masks.

So, come and join us for VBS! At the time of writing, we have over 100 children registered to learn about Jesus, the greatest superhero! Over 100 children, dozens of youth, and a community who need to know that Jesus Christ is the superhero to all superheroes! If you cannot be present. 



Heat exhaustion starts slowly, but if it's not quickly treated it can progress to heatstroke. In heatstroke, a person's temperature reaches 105°F (40.5°C) or higher. Heatstroke requires immediate emergency medical care and can be fatal.



Signs and **Symptoms** Of heat exhaustion:


increased thirst weakness fainting muscle cramps

nausea and vomiting irritability headache increased sweating cool, clammy skin

elevation of body temperature, but to less than 105°F (40.5°C)

Of heatstroke:

severe headache weakness, dizziness confusion rapid breathing and heartbeat



loss of

consciousness leading to coma

seizures

may not be sweating flushed, hot, dry skin

elevation of body temperature to 105°F (40.5°C) or higher

What to Do

If your child has symptoms of heatstroke, seek emergency medical care immediately. In cases of heat exhaustion or while awaiting help for a child with possible heatstroke:

Bring the child indoors or into the shade immediately.

Undress the child.

Have the child lie down; elevate feet slightly.

If the child is alert, place in cool bath water. If outside, spray the child with mist from a garden

If the child is alert and coherent, give frequent sips of cool, clear fluids.

If the child is vomiting, turn onto his or her side to prevent choking.

Think Prevention!

Teach kids to always drink plenty of fluids before and during any activity in hot, sunny weather even if they aren't thirsty.

Make sure kids wear light-colored, loose clothing warm weather.

Don't let kids participate in heavy activity outdoors during the hottest hours of the day.

Teach kids to come indoors immediately whenever they feel overheated.
