Helpless.... So often as we watch the news and hear the updates, we feel helpless. We feel as though there is nothing we can do.

In fact, comedians have even offered satire holding up the mirror to us as we feel overwhelmed and helpless about what is happening around us. (for an example, see Tina Fay on sheetcaking. Warning: some language) Some of us have experienced this in response to the events of Charlottesville and explicit white supremacy. Many of us have experienced it as we watched Hurricane Harvey make landfall in Southern Texas and Louisiana along the Gulf coast.

So many of our hearts have been broken as we have seen images of devastation and spoken to family members and friends in the path of destruction.

We add our prayers for safety and protection for all those who are still in need of rescue.

We add our prayers for those who are beginning to see subsiding flood waters and wonder what comes next. We add our prayers for those who are beginning to do demolition in anticipation of necessary rebuilding, re-evaluating, and restoring.

In the midst of our prayers, many of us desire to add action. What can we do? We feel helpless. UMCOR, United Methodist Committee on Relief, gives these recommendations:

1. Please continue to pray for those whose lives have been impacted by hurricane/tropical storm Harvey. Please also pray for the Early Response Teams, disaster coordinators, and many volunteers in The Texas Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, Louisiana Conference of The United Methodist Church, Río Texas Conference of The United Methodist 2. 4. Consider joining us on September 9th at Christiana HUB (in Delaware at Christiana UMC) at 9:00 am as we bring our supplies and pack buckets and kits to go to those affected by Hurricane Harvey and other disasters.
5. Donate only what is requested. UMCOR has been providing relief in five core areas: Hunger, Health, Refugees, Emergencies, and Relief Supplies since 1940. Their experience has proven successful in over 100 countries and thousands of disasters.
6. Wait for an invitation to volunteer. Some hearts might be moved to provide hands on support for those in need. UMCOR will be evaluating the needs and resources through Early Response teams. They will communicate the needs and there will be opportunities to serve.




Rising Strong (Daring Greatly)

PRAYER BEAD GARDEN GROUNDBREAKING AND CONSECRATION

There could not have been a more beautiful day on Sunday August 20th as we gathered for worship. The sun was



shining and the humidity was low. The breeze was light and the presence of God was surely in this place. We gathered for worship in the sanctuary. We poured out the vinegar and concerns of our heart in prayer. Pastor Shirley shared the insightful parable of pouring out the acidic concerns of our heart like vinegar, so that we can enjoy the luscious oil of God's faithfulness. With the events

of Charlottesville fresh in our minds, Pastor Monica reminded us how important it is that West Grove UMC be both a place of prayer and faith that calls us to action. The congregation responded to the call to action to process outside from the sanctuary to the site for the Prayer Bead Garden. The congregation sang, "I come



to the garden" accompanied by the piano music in the sanctuary and the guitar outside. Pastor Shirley reflected: "Today our lives need a sacred place and space to claim. A place to go



to and just settle into the Presence of Christ. Here the garden promises that place where one can take a breathe and reminds us to focus on what is most important."

We invited members of the Prayer Bead Garden Team to break ground. SAFE SANCTUARIES

As many of you know, our conference has developed a

policy called

"Safe Sanctuaries"

in an effort to keep children, youth and vulnerable adults who participate in programs in



our church, safe. Volunteers who work within these programs are required to have background checks every three years. These include a Criminal Background Check and Child Abuse Clearance. With Sunday School and many other programs beginning after a summer break, please take time to check if your clearances are up-to-date.

I try to send reminders, but I may miss you, especially if you're new to the church or program. If you have clearances from another group, we only need a copy for our files. Just put the copy in my mailbox and I'll get them filed for you and update you on the list.

If you need new clearances, both can now be done on line. For a Criminal Background Check the website is <u>epatch.state.pa.us</u>. The form is SP4-164. For the Child Abuse Clearance the website is <u>compass.state.pa.us/CWIS</u>. The form is CY113. You will be asked to create a Keystone ID for this one. If you have any questions, see me (Fran Miller), or email me at jmille8698@verizon.net or call 610-869-8935.

We have a small group that also helps keep us in compliance with Safe Sanctuaries policy. They are the "Roamers" who are available during the Sunday

School hour. We walk the hall while our Sunday School teachers are working with the children. The



policy requires two adults working with children, but with the Roamer, we have that second adult roaming and available. No teaching or preparation is needed, you are just on hand. We would love to have a couple more Roamers on our list.






Our visitation ministry is busy connecting with people who become unable to fully engage in the life of our church.

She serves as a Commissioner on the Borough of Lansdowne's the Human Relations Commission and the Coordinator of the Delaware Valley Chapter of Binky Patrol which makes security blankets for chronically ill, at-risk and vulnerable children.




