A BEGINNER'S GUIDE

to Protestant Prayer Beads

New Class on Sunday Mornings!

If you would like to enrich your prayer life plan to attend a 4 week class in the making and use of Prayer Beads. The class begins on February 5, 2017 during the Sunday School hour. We will be using the book, A Bead and A Prayer, A beginner's guide to Protestant Prayer Beads by Kristen E. Vincent

Prayer Beads!!! Now What Are They Up To?

The Prayer Team would like to introduce you to Prayer Beads. Here are the answers to a few frequently asked questions.

What Are Prayer Beads? Prayer beads are sets of beads that are designed to help you pray. The earliest use of prayer beads was in 3200 B. C. by the ancient Egyptians. Since then, all major religions have used beads to count prayers, including Christians, Buddists, Hindus and Muslims (while Jews don't use prayer beads, they do use knotted fringe on their shawls, called Tzizits, to count their prayers.)

Why Prayer Beads? Prayer beads can help you focus while praying. They are something to hold on to-they help to ground you and give you a path to follow during your prayer. They also provide structure and comfort.

What do the Beads mean? The beads start with a cross to remind us of Christ's act of salvation for us. The cross leads to the "Invitatory Bead", which can be used as a call to worship to begin your prayer or to recite the Lords Prayer.

Some sets of beads add an additional bead, called the "Resurrection Bead", to the format for the Anglican prayer beads. It is designed to remind us that Christ still lives and has triumphed over death, and can be used to praise God for the promise of eternal life in His kingdom.

Then there are 4 "Cruciform Beads" that form the shape of the cross, when splayed out. The number 4 reminds us of the four Gospels, the four seasons, the four parts of our day (morning, afternoon, evening, and night), and the four directions (north, south, east, and west). Between each of these beads are 7 smaller beads," Week Beads", (the number 7 represents spiritual perfection and also reminds us of the seven days of Creation and the seven seasons of the church year, (Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost, and Ordinary Time).

The total number of beads is 33, which is meant to remind us of the number of years Christ lived on earth, plus one to represent His Resurrection.

- And topped off with the *Power of the Gospel* as the beverage.





Look towards the future: How did you spend for Thanksgiving and Christmas this year? Make a resolution to purchase smaller denomination of cards throughout the year to cover your 2017 holidays?

- **Endowment Fund:** A reserve fund established to save for our future major capital expenditures. Contributions to this fund should be in addition to your tithe commitment.
- **Anniversary Giving:** Extra giving to celebrate our 130th Anniversary--to be used for our general fund expenditures. Our church has run cash deficits for a number of years--our Anniversary Giving will help us get closer to balancing our church budget!
- **Other:** This specified giving should be in addition to your tithe--donations for special collections, Emergency Aid, Food Cupboard, Youth Group, etc.

If you have chosen to give electronically, please include your Giving Number and specify your contribution in the memo section. If there is no specification for your offering, it will be directed to Missions and Ministries.

If you are using Giving Envelopes, please know the envelopes are designed to assist our counters. Please do not use scotch tape, staples, stickers, or glue to seal your envelopes. It is also helpful to place your last name where indicated.
