
NEW MEMBERS CLASS

How to Stay Active in Warm Weather (Excerpts from American heart Association, Healthy For Good™)

Ample sunshine, longer days and warmer temperatures provide more opportunities for the whole family to get outside and get active! But when the temperature goes up, being active outdoors can be more challenging. It's easier to become overheated when the sun is beaming down all day. The warm months also bring humidity to many parts of the country. With humidity, your sweat doesn't evaporate as quickly, so your body has a harder time releasing heat.

Tips to keep in mind:

- Try to avoid exercising outside in the early afternoon. It's usually hottest between noon and 3 p.m.
- Drink water before, during and after physical activity, even if you don't feel thirsty. Bring a bottle of water with you, or plan water stops along your route.
- Wear lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothes.
 Moisture-wicking fabric can also be a big help.
 Protect yourself from the sun with sunglasses, a hat or visor and plenty of sweat-resistant sunscreen.
- Take frequent breaks in the shade, and drink water before you're thirsty. Allow yourself time to adapt to the heat -- some experts say that this can take about 4-14 days. You may not be able to work out as long or as hard as usual when it's very hot.
- Check with your healthcare professional before starting an exercise routine or moving your workout outdoors if you have cardiovascular disease, diabetes, other chronic disease or any medical concerns. Certain medications like beta blockers, ace receptor blockers, ace inhibitors, calcium channel blockers and diuretics can exaggerate the body's response to heat.
- If you can, work out with a partner for safety and fun!

Keep cool as you refuel.

Try light, healthy pre- and post-workout snacks that can also help you stay cool, such as:

- Chilled or frozen fruit
- Homemade popsicles made from 100% fruit juice
- Fruit smoothies
- Cold salads loaded with vegetables, beans, legumes and heart-healthy fish like albacore tuna or salmon
- Crisp, chilled raw veggies like cucumber, carrot or celery with a light, cool dip
- Cold sparkling water with a splash of 100% fruit juice or slices of citrus or cucumber

Beat the heat.

If you find you just can't tolerate the heat, don't skip out on your workout or physical activity time! Find indoor locations where you can be active, such as a shopping mall, gym or community recreation center. Discover activities you can do in your home or at work. Adjust your workout schedule to early morning or late evening when it's cooler outside.

Know the signs of heat-related conditions.

According to the National Institutes of Health, heat illnesses or emergencies can occur with exposure to high temperatures and humidity.

Dehydration can occur when you don't replace body fluids lost by sweating. Being even slightly dehydrated can make you feel bad and put you at greater risk for heat-related illnesses like heat exhaustion and heat stroke.

- Watch for these signs of mild to moderate dehydration:
- Thirst, dry or sticky mouth, dry, cool skin, headache, muscle cramps, not urinating much or darker-colored urine.
- Signs of severe dehydration: Not urinating or very dark-colored urine, dry, shriveled skin, irritability or confusion, dizziness or lightheadedness, rapid heartbeat, breathing rapidly, fatigue or listlessness, unconsciousness
- Heat cramps are the first stage of heat illness and can share some of the symptoms of dehydration:
 Muscle cramps and pains, often in the legs or abdomen, very heavy sweating, fatigue, thirst.
- Heat exhaustion symptoms include: Headache, dizziness or lightheadedness, weakness, cool, moist skin, dark urine, nausea and vomiting,

If you experience signs of dehydration, heat cramps or heat exhaustion: Stop exercising right away, sip water or suck on ice cubes, move to the shade or indoors as soon as possible, douse yourself with cold water, apply cold, wet cloths to the neck, groin and armpits. Seek medical attention if your condition doesn't improve or gets worse.

Heat stroke is when the body is no longer able to regulate its temperature, and it keeps rising. This is very serious and requires immediate medical attention. Call 9-1-1 and take the actions above right away if you experience these symptoms: High fever (above 104 degrees F), dry, red skin fast, weak pulse, fast, shallow breathing, irrational behavior or extreme confusion, seizure or unconsciousness.

SCRIP Scripts

With over 750 retailers to choose from, Shop With Scrip is an easy way to patronize your favorite merchants and raise money for WGUMC. For every dollar you spend, merchants will rebate WGUMC from 1% to 20% (and sometimes even more during special promotions). Here's how it works:

There are several ways to participate in the program. First, go to shopwithscrip.com and click on the "Shop" tab for a listing of the participating merchants. Next, select a merchant by clicking on their logo and the rebate to WGUMC will be displayed. Delivery options are also displayed, with many of them offering three different methods. A "Physical" is an actual plastic card that is shipped once a month to WGUMC. "Scrip Now" is an email with a barcode that is sent directly to you. You can print it out and present it to the cashier at checkout or save the image on your smart phone. A "Reload" card is a traditional plastic card, but instead of having to reorder a new card when it is exhausted, you can create your

own account online, register your card and reload it anytime you like.

Payments for the purchases are linked to your bank account in a secure environment making this one of the fastest and most convenient methods.

Another method is to pick up one of the order forms in the Narthex. Simply place your order form and a check made payable to WGUMC in Gene Aucott's mailbox in the mailroom.

STATISTICAL REPORT

Overall, Christian education has grown at West Grove. More people engaging in more different ways. We took a risk two years ago and moved away from all long term courses and moved toward short term course. We called it Faith Learning Academy. The result was more options and people responded. From 2016 to 2017, children (ages 0-11) increased from 51 involved to 70. Our youth have had a rebuilding time and our numbers have reflected that. In 2016, there were 61 youth involved; 2017, 43 youth engaged. Young adult engaged in 2016 were 32 and 43 in 2017. All adults participants across all Christian formation from Sunday School to courses to small groups grew from 252 in 2016 to 406 in 2017.

Vacation Bible School participation including youth and volunteers was 181 in 2016 and 2017 was 182! We give thanks to God for all those who share the love of God with the community.

West Grove has a tradition of holding Confirmation class every other year to give 7th and 8th graders an opportunity to build community. This upcoming year will be Confirmation Class. We look forward to all our 7th and 8th graders joining us for this journey.

In 2016, we held 12 small groups and learning opportunities outside of Sunday School, including Daily Reflections and Pastor Jim's Bible Studies. This grew in 2017 to 17, including groups like antiracism training, Making Sense of the Bible, Movies.

Next month, we'll chat about United Methodist Men, United Methodist Women, and mission engagement!
