"Jesus sat down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny. Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on.' " Mark 12:41-44

We have been in the midst of potty training this summer. For Peter, that is. All summer, we have been trying to teach him the practice of using the potty. I imagine for you and me that this is pretty standard.

We understand that each and every day using the bathroom will be a part of our lives. However for a child of three years old, there is some learning and some resistance to the discipline and practice of using the potty every single day. *How long do I have to sit? How many minutes do I have to do it?*

We hear over and over again. He wants to do something else. He want to play with trucks. He has a hard time seeing how this will ever be important in his life. Sometimes, he has accidents. At the age of three and half, he has a hard time understanding why pull-ups or even diapers aren't the way of the world forever. This process of learning has come through discipline and practice.

Our faith life is made up of a collection of practices. Practices that make space for God and that connect us to Jesus. I shared this wisdom from spiritual leader Henri Nouwen about discipleship on Sunday, September 19th in my sermon:

"The word discipleship and the word discipline are the same word, which has always fascinated me. Once you have made the choice to say, "Yes, I want to follow Jesus," the question is, "What disciplines will help me remain faithful to that choice?" If we want to be disciples of Jesus, we have to live a disciplined life. But in the spiritual life, the word discipline means "the effort to create some space in which God can act." Discipline means to prevent everything in your life from being filled up. Discipline means that somewhere you're not occupied, and certainly not preoccupied. In the spiritual life, discipline means to create that space in which something can happen that you hadn't planned or counted on." [1]

The early church talked about seven such practices: fasting, communion, tithing, prayer, Sabbath, communal worship, pilgrimage. All of these practices find their home in biblical practices and commandments. We can see the value of all practices and may try to incorporate them into our lives. Of these practices, tithing is often one that is disregarded the quickest. Talking about financial matters touches at the heart of uncomfortability for many people. However, this is not an invitation to end the conversation. Each of these disciplines, shapes the disciples, then and now, who practice them.

Each time my family is faithful in tithing, I watch God's faithfulness in providing for us in ways we did not expect. Our faithfulness to the practice of tithing has created space for God to act in ways we have not planned. I am not suggesting that tithing one day, will place a check in your mailbox the next day like an galactic ATM. Rather across generations, the practice of tithing changes the giver to see God's character.

As you prayerfully consider how you will live as disciple of Jesus Christ, let me share the following about the widow who Jesus watched give.

- *The widow was intentional. She had a plan as to how she would give and what she would give. Sometimes we walk into church on a Sunday morning and just put something in the plate. It is often whatever is in our wallets instead of what we have intentionally planned to give. Take time to prayerfully reflect on how God is calling you to intentionally give.*
- *The widow was a regular giver. Jesus knew she put in all she had because he had seen her there before. Giving was a part of her discipleship. Regularly set aside time to review giving and budgeting. Let your giving and tithing be a part of your discipleship.*
- *The widow was generous. She gave all she had. Scholars have conjectured that the community was responding to her gift with support as she urged them on to generosity. Sometimes we need to see someone else be generous in order to be generous ourselves. Prayerfully consider how are you being stretched to be generous.*

Potty training can be a difficult business. It requires practices and discipline. It requires agility to revise your reward system when the first one doesn't work. However, ultimately the goal is for the child to be potty trained. We live out our discipleship in the same way. Practices of faith that make space for us to see where God is already at work. Tithing creates spaces in our lives as intention, regular, generous disciples.

I pray for each of us that we might offer our lives as holy experiments of discipleship.

- I love hearing that someone traveling for work was able to see their child's comments at the children's message, because we were live in worship.
- I love hearing that a homebound member can feel connected to church, because church is bigger than the building.

We are growing into our own technology. It may take time. We need your skills and patience.

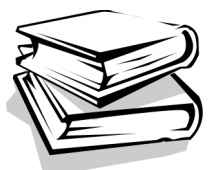

UNITED METHODIST MEN

Helping Men Grow In Christ, So Others May Know Christ.

All men from our congregation are invited to join the Lanchester United Methodist Men (UMM). It is a cluster of five local churches that meet monthly (September-June) on a rotating basis for dinner, singing, sharing, and a presentation each evening. Except for November and June, and our end of the season Family Night dinner, all meetings are held on the fourth Monday of the month. Dinner starts at 6:45 and we finish around 8:30. Our present cluster of churches includes Cochranville UMC, Pomeroy UMC, Faith Community UMC, Kemblesville UMC, Fremont UMC and Parkesburg UMC.

Monthly meetings include a dinner served by the hosting church, followed by singing of a few hymns, ending with a speaker or other entertainment chosen by the hosting church. Over the years we have had a wide range of people in this spot. Some giving their testimony, chaplains from local VA hospitals and prisons, fish and game wardens, war veterans, comedians, musical groups, and storytellers just to name a few.

Our November meeting at Parkesburg UMC is "Children's Night". This program is geared for entertainment for both children and adults. Our June meeting is "Family Night" and welcomes our church families to the Christiana Fire Hall for an evening of fellowship and entertainment.

Our fundraiser each year is our collection of toys and gifts for the Methodist Home for Children in Philadelphia. During the month of November each church collects toys for the children and gifts for the single women living at this location or one of their satellite facilities. All unwrapped toys and gifts are then brought to Parkesburg UMC. Then in the beginning of December all are encouraged to meet at Parkesburg UMC to load up the toys and gifts in enclosed pickup trucks where we then carpool into Philadelphia for delivery. After unloading we get an escorted tour of the facility. We usually stop at Olive Garden for lunch before heading home.

- Children will remain in worship instead of

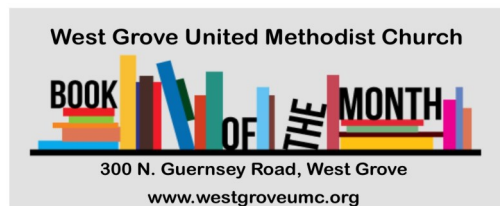
being dismissed to Children's Worship. This allows for children to be fully present at the table.

again. Their residents always give us a very warm welcome.

Every year we try to improve our skills by incorporating different techniques and by playing music with different difficulty levels. We try to select music that will make a definite contribution to our worship by celebrating the different seasons of the calendar year and the church year. The dynamics of our bell choir changes occasionally and the past few years we had a father/son as well as a husband/wife combo. This year we will again have a husband/wife combo, a mother/daughter duo, and a mother/son partnership. Once or twice a year we try to add young people and different instrumentation to some of our selections to incorporate an intergenerational and expanded scope to the music we play.

I feel very privileged to be the director of this very special bell choir made up of enthusiastic and committed ringers. We enjoy making "a joyful noise."

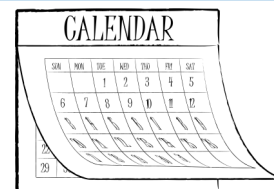

Often I listen to people reflect on their legacy:

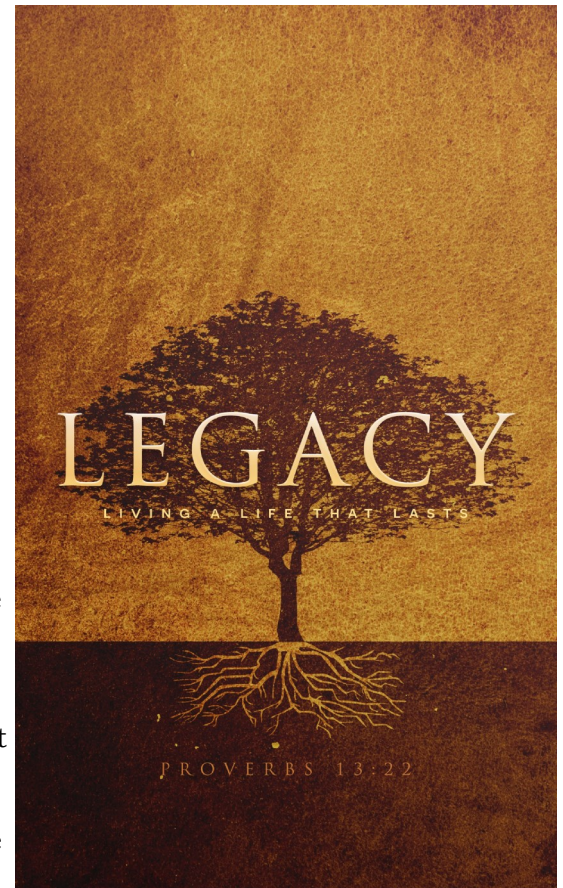
How have I impacted the world?
