## **New Testament Lesson: Philippians 2:19-30**

I hope in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy to you soon, so that I may be cheered by news of you. I have no one like him who will be genuinely concerned for your welfare. All of them are seeking their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ. But Timothy's worth you know, how like a son with a father he has served with me in the work of the gospel. I hope therefore to send him as soon as I see how things go with me; and I trust in the Lord that I will also come soon.

Still, I think it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus—my brother and co-worker and fellow soldier, your messenger and minister to my need; for he has been longing for all of you, and has been distressed because you heard that he was ill. He was indeed so ill that he nearly died. But God had mercy on him, and not only on him but on me also, so that I would not have one sorrow after another. I am the more eager to send him, therefore, in order that you may rejoice at seeing him again, and that I may be less anxious. Welcome him then in the Lord with all joy, and honor such people, because he came close to death for the work of Christ, risking his life to make up for those services that you could not give me.

## **Gospel Lesson: Matthew 6:25-34**

“Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? Therefore do not worry, saying, ‘What will we eat?’ or ‘What will we drink?’ or ‘What will we wear?’ For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.”

## **MOMENT OF IMPACT**

### **Mpsa Medical Center**

West Grove UMC joins with our brothers and sisters across the South district in continued support of the Mpsa Medical Center in Democratic Republic of Congo. The Mpsa Medical Center provides important medical services for this region and has been significantly improved in recent years due to the generosity of the South District. The South District made it possible for Mpsa to construct a new medical building for pediatrics and two well equipped operating theaters and solar power for the entire Medical Center. A new Ophthalmology Clinic will soon be launched adding another vital service for the people in this region.

With the improved medical care and ongoing nutrition provision, many people in the Mpsa region cannot afford to pay for all their medical services or for feeding their children. While the solution to this problem for the entire region is beyond the scope of the Partnership, we do believe we can make a significant difference by providing education and training for people surrounding the Mpsa Medical & Nutrition Center.

The funding from the South District 2019 Mission will enable the expansion of the New Life Skills Program as well as the creation of a Microloan Program. The priority for the Peter D. Weaver Congo Partnership in all its projects in Congo is self-sustainability. Given the extreme poverty in the MPASA region where 4.5 million refugees have settled, the goal of self-sustainability is very difficult. Many of the people cannot afford to adequately feed their children compelling the Partnership to continue to provide nutrition programs for the malnourished children in the area.

New Life Skills (NLS) programming will provide training in a trade and also include other academic skills training. Skill offered will include:

- Sewing
- Sandal making
- Tie Dyeing fabrics
- Soap Making - for laundry and personal use
- Bakery

Microloans: The South District will provide the funds for the Congo Partnership to launch a Microloan program for the people of Mpsa, Congo. After researching numerous models for providing microloans, it was decided the best model was to develop a Community Bank of the residents in the area. Participants must make some personal investment in the bank. The pooled funds can then allow persons to request a loan from the established “bank”.

Education: In addition to providing the funding for New Life Skills Programming and a Community Bank, a portion of the funds raised by the South District will be used to offer partial scholarship for the children in the Nutrition Program to attend public school. Education is the key to break this poverty cycle.

We are give thanks to God for all those who have made an impact together in the lives of those in the Congo!

# Meditations For Your Week

## PRAYER OF OUR HANDS TO PRAY DAILY

Gracious and Loving God, your love holds us and encourages us not to be anxious, but to trust in you. We strive and reason. Let us love our worries, by trusting them into your care for transformation and possibility. Urge us to seek your kingdom and righteous. Grant us your peace, we pray, Amen.

**Sunday:** *"I hope in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy to you soon, so that I may be cheered by news of you. I have no one like him who will be genuinely concerned for your welfare. Philippians 2:19-20.* Take time today to pray for the welfare of all those on your prayer lists.

**Monday:** *"I am the more eager to send him, therefore, in order that you may rejoice at seeing him again, and that I may be less anxious." Philippians 2:28.* Paul's letter reminds us that we can reduce the angst of those around us. Where is God calling you to be a calming presence in the life of someone today?

**Tuesday:** *"Welcome him then in the Lord with all joy, and honor such people, because he came close to death for the work of Christ, risking his life to make up for those services that you could not give me." Philippians 2:29-30.* Consider the body of Christ is made up of many members. Not all members can perform every function. As you welcome and greet each person today, consider how their gifts are vital to body of Christ.

**Thursday:** *"Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?'" Matthew 6:31.* Pray for those in systemic poverty, specifically those who are hungry, thirsty, and concerned about clothing. Prayerfully discern if the movement of your heart is calling you to action.

**Saturday:** *"So, do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today." Matthew 6:34.* As you lay your head down tonight, close your eyes and remember each person your spoke with. Pray for them and their troubles.
