To those under the law I became like one under the law (though I myself am not under the law), so as to win those under the law.

To those not having the law I became like one not having the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law), so as to win those not having the law. To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some."

1 Corinthians 9: 20-22

Do you remember the first movie that you saw in the movie theater? (share with me. I'm curious!)

There is nothing like the first experience of going to the movie theater! The summer of 1986 was as hot and sticky as it has been some of the past couple of days. Heat waves lingered such that no one even wanted to spend time by the pool. My mother and the neighborhood ladies were looking for something to do with the gaggle of children, aged from 10 to 4(little me!). And they took us to the air-conditioned movies to see a recently released Care Bears Movie II: A New Generation! There was buttery popcorn, fizzy sodas, and seats that rocked back and forth (even though my feet couldn't reach the floor!). And the movie screen was so large that the Care Bears came out of my imagination and to the rescue of the young orphan camper in need! And of course, I went with them! When we came out of the theater, I was ready to go back! To step back into another story and envision how I, too could be a part of the rescue. All that summer, I saw Jungle Book, Wizard of Oz, Mary Poppins, and many more.

Since then, like many of you, the my movies tastes and genres have expanded in width and depth. I have come to see themes of faith and opportunities to explore imagery within our films. Movies are a tool to be used to share the message of the gospel with others. The message of the gospel never changes, however the context and the container change regularly. Throughout the month of July, we will have opportunity to explore just a few movies with profound themes. These movies highlight: What Makes a Hero? God calls ordinary people like you and me to do extraordinary things each and every day. What is it that allows some of us to rise to the occasion? In these movies, we will take a look at what biblical qualities we can cultivate: courage, persistence and faith in the midst of challenge, we are stronger together, and justice.

Biblical heroes show us that none of those qualities is easy to achieve, but each quality is one towards which we strive. The courage of David standing against Goliath was not born of waking up with moxie one morning. Rather, the confidence and skill was born over time in the fields as a shepherd as well as reliance on God. David developed courage, and persistence. Additionally, "[The Archbishop] Desmond Tutu has described good leaders as having an uncanny sense of timing. "The real leader," he writes, knows "when to make concessions, when to compromise, when to employ the art of losing the battle in order to win the war." (Harvard Business Review, January 2007). David models this.

Many of us have heard the story of David and Goliath time and time again as a child, a youth, and into our adult years. What if we hear the story of David as told through the movie, the Lion King?

How differently, we would watch the movie (first of all).

Next, we could tell the story of good news differently to our friends and our kids!

The good news of Jesus never changes, however, the ways in which people can hear it may. Are you willing to watch a movie to share the good news with others?

Join us on Wednesday nights to see the whole movie! Then come back on Sunday to hear how you can share the good news through these movies.

A nationally recognized leader, speaker, and author on evangelism and church revitalization, the Rev. Junius B. Dotson is the General Secretary (chief executive officer) of Discipleship Ministries, an international agency of The United Methodist Church with a staff of 135. Dotson launched "See All The People", the highly successful church-wide initiative that helps church leaders concentrate on intentional discipleship, while learning new behaviors around engaging their surrounding community.

Rev. Dotson is the author of Developing an Intentional Discipleship System: A Guide for Congregations, and Engaging Your Community: A Guide to Seeing All the People. Both resources help congregations look beyond their walls, acknowledging that God calls us to have "meaningful relationships in authentic, organic and consistent ways." His newest book, Soul Reset: Breakdown, Breakthrough, and the Journey to Wholeness (Upper Room Books) is set for release in September 2019.

As a leader who responds to challenges and opportunities in new and creative ways, Rev. Dotson believes that effective ministry is about training, developing, and empowering leaders to establish ministries that address the needs of the whole person – body, mind, and spirit.







Bring your lawn chair and take the night off! All are welcome!





## IRA Tax-Free Donations

### REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTION: **HOW CAN I SERVE?**

If you have heard about required minimum distribution from your individual retirement account, and wondered how that might work, consider serving the church through this gift. The criteria is:

- You must be 70 ½ or older when the transfer is made.
- The transfer must go directly from your IRA administrator to your church.
- Rollover gifts are limited to \$100,000 per taxpayer per year. If married, and each spouse has an IRA, then each may gift up to \$100,000.
- The gift counts toward your IRA required minimum distribution.
- The distribution is not reported as income, so there is no adverse income tax effect.
- Gifts must be outright: not to donor advised funds, charitable remainder trusts, or for charitable gift annuities. Gifts can fulfill your local church pledge.


Mission Central is the mission warehouse of the
