

### New Short-term Courses FOUNDATION DOCUMENTS OF METHODISM

What do Methodists believe? This course will focus on the documents that form the basis for our Methodist belief. These documents date back to the founding era of Methodism and stem from John Wesley himself. When United Methodist pastors are ordained, they are questioned about their support for these documents. However, many Methodist laypeople have never encountered them. You may be surprised by some of the beliefs and practices these documents espouse. The course will run for 3 weeks, beginning Sunday, January 12, and will meet from 9:45 - 10:45 a.m. in Room 5 (the Men's Class meeting room). The course will be taught by Dr. David Frame, retired UM pastor. This course will be immediately followed by a second short-term class, And Know that I am God: Our future with hope, beginning Sunday, February 2, in which Pastor Monica will present information about plans and legislation for the future of United Methodism that are to be considered at the General Conference in May. As a member of the 2020 Delegation to General Conference and Jurisdictional Conference and adjunct instructor for previous General Conferences, Pastor Monica will present the process for voting at the General Conference, Annual Conference, as well as the implications for the local church. Pastor Monica's class will also meet on Sundays from 9:45 - 10:45 a.m. in Room 5. All interested persons are welcome to attend these two courses.




### CMO and Preschool News for December



# STEWARDSHIP



### WEST GROVE UMC FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Our church financial condition continues to be stable through the eleven months ended November 30, 2019 although, for the month of November, we incurred a cash shortfall. In November, we received income of \$30,895 and incurred \$32,636 of expenses resulting in an excess of expenses over cash received in the amount of \$1,741. This is a reasonable outcome given that we paid \$13,940 of catch-up payments for conference apportionments and also had low overall spending for the month.



For the year-to-date eleven month period ended November 30, 2019, we received total income of \$355,970 and incurred total expenses of \$349,801 resulting in an excess of cash received over expenses in the amount of \$6,169. Our 2019 apportionments are paid up through July but we remain \$18,018 in arrears as of November 30. We will meet again at the end of December to determine how much additional we can pay by year end.





Clark grew up in Philadelphia, PA with her three sisters and one brother (one sister passed away in August 2019). She was educated in the parochial school system of Philadelphia and upon graduation from high school, she attended Lincoln University in Oxford, PA with a major in French and a minor in Secondary Education. Rev. Clark responded to the call to ordained ministry after 13 years as an educator in the public school system. She received her Local Pastor's License in 1993 and her Masters of Divinity from Eastern Baptist Theological Seminary, currently known as Palmer Seminary, in 2000. She was ordained as an elder in the United Methodist Church in 2003 and is currently serving as the pastor of two churches in the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference: New Life UMC in Drexel Hill, PA and Trinity Lansdowne UMC (known as The Garden Church) in historic Lansdowne, PA.

Rev. Clark served the General Church as a member of the General Board of Discipleship. She has also served as a member of the Congregational Transformation Team, co-chairperson of Calling Disciples Resource Team, member of the Commission on Equitable Compensation, president of Black United Methodist Preachers, member of Black Methodist for Church Renewal and as the secretary and chairperson of the Committee on Episcopacy. She is currently chairperson of the Order of Elders, co-chairperson of the South District Committee on Ordained Ministry and a member of the Board of Ordained Ministry and its executive committee.

Rev. Clark was a facilitator for the Forum for Female Scholars at the 2006 Gates Millennium Scholars Leadership Conference in Chantilly, Virginia. In that same year, Rev. Clark received the Denman Award for evangelism. In March of 2007 she accepted an invitation to the University of Oxford, in Oxford, England to present and dialogue on the topic "Science and Religion: Is There Common Ground?" She is a member of Biltmore Who's Who, having qualified for inclusion in the 2007-2008 edition of the registry of executives and professionals. In 2017 Rev. Clark had the extreme honor of being a recipient of the Presidential Lifetime Achievement Award by President Barak Obama.

Rev. Clark is married to Rev. Noah Reid III. They have 2 adult children and 1 delightful grand-daughter: Rashawn Clark who is married to Kellee Clark and they have one child, Gabrielle, and one daughter, Amey Reid
