Gospel Lesson: Romans 5:1-11

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life. Report from March 8, 2020

Peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ our Savior.

Yesterday, the World Health Organization declared the COVID-19 a global pandemic, and new cases are diagnosed in the United States. While we have not had a case in Chester County, I want to let you know that we, too, are taking the health, well-being, and safety of everyone in our church and community very seriously. I want to communicate some precautions and plans that we are putting in place for our community together.

I have been meeting with county public health officials this week to connect with the most up to date information in our area. We have also been preparing ways to support those in our community who may be affected by a reduction in social services.

We also care for those who have illnesses that leave them vulnerable to germs and infection. Beginning this week and Sunday, March 15, we expand our efforts to create a safe and comfortable environment on Sunday mornings:

- We have expanded our cleaning of the physical space. All chairs, tables and hard surfaces as well as bathrooms are being disinfected with CDC approved cleaning products. These products will be available in the rooms for our community partners who use our space to wipe down the surfaces after each use as well.
- Our preschool, CMO, is in close conversation and collaboration. They are regularly sanitizing children's items and encouraging regular hand washing for children and adults.
- In worship, we will not pass the offering plates. Offering baskets will be available in the rows. If you have been thinking about making the switch to online giving, this is the perfect time-click here to start the process.
- In worship, we will shift our seating to increase the space between chairs to allow for more social distancing.
- In worship, we encourage you to pass the peace in ways that are comfortable to you including: waving, bowing, placing your hands over your heart, tapping feet.
- In fellowship time, our snacks will be prepackaged. Our hospitality hosts will continue in their practices of wearing gloves in preparation. They will also wear gloves in serving snacks, and they will sanitize the hard surfaces between services.
- We join with the guidelines of the CDC and public health officials to remind you to wash your hands with soap and water for 20 seconds and remain home if you are feeling ill (from this illness or another).

We are working on options for live streaming, but do not currently have that option available for this Sunday, March 15th. We will let you know when that is an option for you.

In the meantime, our life together continues! Check here for more details. And I'm still free to meet you for coffee or lunch. Feeling isolated or lonely in this time? Need someone to pray with you or for you? You can email me anytime at pastor@westgroveumc.org. Our church community remains here in all seasons, for all reasons.

In the weeks ahead, we will continue to keep the health and well-being of both our congregation and the

community in mind as we make decisions and will keep you updated.

Don't be anxious about anything; rather, bring up all of your requests to God in your prayers and petitions, along with giving thanks. Then the peace of God that exceeds all understanding will keep your hearts and minds safe in Christ Jesus. From now on, brothers and sisters, if anything is excellent and if anything is admirable, focus your thoughts on these things: all that is true, all that is holy, all that is just, all that is pure, all that is lovely, and all that is worthy of praise.

-Philippians 4:6-8

Paul's words from Philippians remind us that in times of stress and anxiety, that "if anything is excellent and if anything is admirable, focus your thoughts on these things." May we focus our prayers and actions, thoughts and conversations on this. The presence of God who gives us peace will guide us as we pray, "Give us this day our daily bread." God not only gives us our physical nourishment, but our spiritual nourishment as well. Thanks be to God!

Meditations For Your Week

Sunday, March 15 ~ Saturday, March 22, 2020

- **Sunday:** "Your kingdom come. Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." Matthew 6:10. Jesus taught us to how to pray and how to love others. Challenge yourself this week to be a reflection of Jesus' love and care for all.
- **Monday:** "Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Romans 5:1. With our faith comes peace that goes beyond all understanding. What can you do today to share that peace with others?
- **Tuesday:** "through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God." Romans 5:2. The word boast can sometimes have a negative connotation. In this passage, we are being encouraged to REJOICE in the grace that God has given us and to share that with others. How are your rejoicing today in God's grace today?
- **Wednesday:** "For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly." Romans 5:6. Praise be to God! God's timing is always perfect. Do you feel that some of your prayers are not being answered? Do not fear! Have faith that God will answer you in his perfect timing.
- **Thursday:** "But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us." Romans 5:8. No greater sacrifice will ever be made on our behalf. Praise God by showing his love to others this day.
- **Friday:** "Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God." Romans 5:9. It is hard to consider raising children without the need to provide discipline to direct them to proper behavior. Reflect on how to redirect any behaviors you may have that do not reflect gratitude for being justified by grace and saved from God's wrath.
- **Saturday:** "But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation." Romans 5:11. We rejoice once more this week for the saving grace of Jesus Christ. We are reconciled with the Lord forever. Is there someone in your life that you need to reconcile with? Consider reaching out today.
