

MOMENT OF IMPACT Apportionments

Every local church/charge sends at least one clergy and one lay person to their annual conference session. General Conference delegates are elected. Members from Every church/charge vote on which clergy and laypersons should represent them at General Conference. General Conference sets mission goals and budget for UMC. For the upcoming four years, what are the goals we want for the global UMC, and what will it cost to achieve them? Every Annual Conference get a fair share of the global budget. Our General Council on Finance and Administration (GCFA) determines how much is apportioned to each conference based on a formula that includes factors like membership, economics, etc.

Annual Conference includes its share of the Global UMC mission in their conference budget proposal. Your conference has goals for mission and prepares a budget to support those goals; included is the apportioned share of the budget for the Global UMC. Conference budget is approved at annual session. Members from every church/charge have the opportunity to examine, question and debate before they vote on a conference mission and budget they believe their church can support.

Each church receives a faire share portion of the conference budget. Your conference Council on Finance & Administration uses a formula—approved at an annual conference session—to determine each local church/charge's faire share portion of

Conference budget. This amount is included in your local church budget, which allows your church to make an impact locally, across the conference and around the world.

Gospel Lesson: *Luke 15:1-3; 11b-32*

Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. 2 And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them." So he told them this parable: Then Jesus said, "There was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me.' So he divided his property between them. A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and traveled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands." So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. Then the son said to him, Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly, bring out a robe—the best one—and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' And they began to celebrate.

"Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. He replied, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.' Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!' Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. 32 But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found."

FOOD PANTRY: Our Food Pantry is still going strong! Last week we were able to help over 25 families providing 75 bags of groceries. We are down from our high point of over 60 families, but the need in our community is still great. With your generosity and our collaboration with our community partners, we are feeding our neighbors, discovering their need for rental and utility assistance, and disseminating information about public health. We can also store and distribute fresh produce and proteins. As your garden grows, consider sharing with the food pantry. If you have eggs, consider sharing some with your neighbors. Meditations For Your Week

Sunday, June 28~ Saturday, July 4, 2020

- **Sunday:** "Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him." Luke 15: 1. Jesus was first and foremost a teacher. People came to hear him. Listen to the stories of Jesus. Parables are invitations into God's sacred future that we are supposed to make happen.
- **Monday:** "Then Jesus said, "There was a man who had two sons. "Luke 15: 11. Pray for parents who are raising children. May they be filled with wisdom and humility to raise godly children who seek a path of curiosity and dependence on God's ways.
- **Tuesday:** "Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on." Luke 15: 25-26. Consider that sibling rivalry is recorded in the biblical witness. Many of us are familiar with the concept. Pray for siblings as they compare themselves to one another. May a spirit of cooperation be known in the families.
- **Wednesday:** "But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends." Luke 15: 27-29. Where do you find yourself in the voice of the older brother as he expresses frustration as the father showers love on the prodigal son? Where is God inviting you ask for forgiveness and welcome the prodigal back yourself?
- **Thursday:** "But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!" Luke 15: 30. The cry of the indignant can cloud our vision to love and compassion. The cry of unrighteous rage can keep us from seeing God's movement. What anger do you need to let go of today?
- **Friday:** "Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. Luke 15: 31. Consider that we have sometimes taken for granted God, and we have gotten comfortable. God is giving us all that God has! Pray for a heart to receive God's generosity and a spirit to respond.
- **Saturday:** "But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found." Luke 15: 32. God's grace is bigger than our imagination. God's mercy is wider than the sea. Soak in the grace and mercy of God whose love is encompassing.
