Learn to Think Like Him

As a tier two provider for the Chester County Food Bank we are fortunate to receive premade food bags and produce from them. We are also blessed by the many folks who are donating fresh produce from their gardens. We have consistently been serving 20 to 25 families each week throughout these last few months. **Our Food Pantry is open every Thursday from 4-6 pm.**
