

The family will remember those moments as a time of friendship in fun and love together. I was grateful the father didn't let the pressures of life keep him from important moments with his children. Many people are learning where their true priorities are today. I remember many of the people I've known who lived through the Great Depression, saying they didn't have much money or cash, but they had each other in real friendships, and that was the greater treasure.

Every generation has its challenges and times when it is especially important to look to God and stay close to His Presence. God's creativity is far more expansive and substantive than we expect. We are also especially blessed by the faithful people who have put their lives to vocations dedicated to serving others through the medical community as physicians, nurses, aids, and technicians, and also in medical research. We are so close to getting past the challenge of the virus in a vaccine, it is important that we keep to the requirements and guard the health of our community, our families, and individual lives. My prayers are that we all follow through with all these efforts, seeing how precious and sacred life is.

#### **Preparing for Christ**

Advent is a time when we stay alert and look for ways that Christ will come into our hearts and lives, often in unexpectedly blessed ways. Many times, when Jesus lifts up our attention as disciples to look at the future, he instructs us to, "Keep awake!" Staying alert and being expectant is a sign of the hope and trust we have in God, and that God has in us. We don't make our own plans and then demand God put them into effect, telling him how and when to do it. In discipleship, we move beyond attempting to limit, confine, or control what God is doing and wants to do for us. God wants us to live in God's creative freedom. We don't want to miss the opportunities to grow and mature in faith and our friendships with God and each other.

So we don't listen to voices of destruction. It isn't that we are avoiding the truth about the dangers around us. We are not in denial; we live in reality, courageous enough to face the truth, and how much we need God. We know it is God's Word we need to hear above all others. Through it all, the dangers and disappointments are not what will define us. God's love is what creates and will recreate us. And we seek to still be faithful. I give a special thanks for the ways so many people are trying to do their best to share what we can through these times of need. Far too many people are overwhelmed economically, in their health, and in the ways we are challenged to live life. Thanks to Joan Leaman and Karen Hruz and the crews of people who help with our Food Pantry. We've also been able to host the Mighty Writers in their food distribution of several boxes of food to over 300 families each week and distribution of over 300 winter coats to children in need. Our CMO is serving the families and teaching the children of this important ministry. We pray and look for ways we can share faith and fellowship with these neighbors going forward.

A pastoral care guideline I learned early in ministry was that for every day a person is in a hospital bed, it takes a week to recover one's strength. So how long will it take for many of us to come back and move forward from the effects of the virus on our lives? Not just those who contracted the disease, but all of us in community. What exercise and therapy of our hearts, minds, and souls can we engage in to prepare for the opportunities before us after being so restricted? We must give ourselves time and space to regain our strength in the year ahead. Time does not heal all wounds. God's grace, mercy, and love do! Prepare to receive God's grace this season. I pray it flows strongly in your lives as it overflows to the others in your life.

#### Like Envisioning Heaven

What will you do when you are safe from the virus, able to take the vaccine? What will you do when everyone else is safe too? I'm sure everyone has dreams and hopes that we look forward to fulfilling. Whatever the image that comes to mind, it often sounds like images of what heaven is like: A reunion of affection, deep friendship in joy; the ability to sing and get closer to God with each other and meet again. God can empower and guide our living. What a joy it is to know that God will "rise up and have compassion" on us all. Christ will come to us again this Christmas season. Perhaps not in the ways we have grown accustomed to, but in ways that will be faithful and help us grow in God's love and grace in new ways. Please join us in our celebrations of faith as we make more room for Christ to be at home in our hearts. – Tim

#### **Consecration Sundays**

We celebrated the consecration of our time and talents on Sunday, November 15 by looking at the scripture from I Corinthians 12:14-27. Paul tells us that as part of our Christian fellowship together, we are all parts of the body of Christ. Every one of us has an important part to play,

ministry to do, to help bring wholeness and healing. He tells us that it is often the unseen parts that are the most necessary. The body can't do well, and survival is at risk, without all the parts working together. Our lives have a holy purpose that needs to be strengthened and refined. We never want to deprive anyone of their sacred character, showing disrespect, contempt or being destructive of the sacred nature. We affirm what God can do. Please take the time if you haven't already done so, to prayerfully fill out a Time & Talent commitment sheet, and know time and talent is a precious gift of that we consecrate to God and share with one another. Sheets are available on the web site or at the church office. Thank you to everyone who has already done so as we use them to strengthen our ministries.

When we think about generosity, we often think about the widow Jesus pointed out to his disciples at the Temple who gave her last two copper mites, barely a penny's worth in value. She gave her all, in spite of many reasons not to. (Mark 12, and Luke 21) The Temple and religious leaders were arrogant, competitive, and corrupt. Yet she gave all she had to God. We don't face such imposing barriers to our giving today. We are empowered by God's Covenant, and the power of Resurrection and its promise of creativity, freedom, and life. Envisioning the future in 2021 builds trust, hope, and provides direction as we realistically plan for our ministries ahead.

A piece of spiritual wisdom urges us to take time during our devotions to pray over our calendars and check books. I know the advice is getting old because many people don't use either one much anymore. There are contemporary ways to be faithful to the practice and to faithfully respond. How we handle time, talent, and financial resources will have a huge impact on our journey of faith and life for good or bad. The focus is always on God with love of neighbor interwoven too. We invite you to prayerfully make the time to share with God and respond to the vision God provides. Life is a huge blessing that is a joy to share. May God bless our lives and lead us to effectively share in ministry together.



# CHURCH FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

The church food pantry has been busy serving 30-35 families each week. We have been able to supply each family with about 20 nonperishable items and 6-10 pounds of produce, meat and eggs each week. Beginning in December, we will change our **Thursday distribution time to 5:00-6:00**. Due to the

December holidays, a few adjustments have been made to our distribution schedule. **The schedule is as follows: Dec. 3 and 10 (5:00-6:00), Dec. 21 (5:00-6:00), Dec. 31 (1:00-2:00).** If you, or you know of others, that would benefit from receiving food from our pantry, please encourage them to come on Thursdays. If you are able to support our pantry with food donations, the most appreciated and needed items are listed here: canned tomatoes, corn tortillas, rice, cereal or oatmeal, canned meat/tuna, canned vegetables, canned soup, canned fruit, dry or canned beans and eggs. The best time to drop off food, especially if you have any food that needs refrigeration, **is weekdays, between the hours of 9:00-2:00,** when Donna Fackler is in the building. You may also put donations in the shopping cart, outside the main entrance, when the building is closed. Monetary donations, are also greatly appreciated. If giving with a check, please make it out to the church and note in the memo "Food Pantry." 

#### **Annual Conference 2020**

2020 has certainly been different. We have learned new ways to worship and to care for one another. New ways for our children to attend school. We are nothing but resilient with God's guidance.

And annual conference, this year was no different in it's innovation. No, we couldn't gather and worship as in previous years. It was very limited in the presentation and discussion of resolutions. The business portion of conference was scheduled for a 4 hour webinar. Amazing, that it took 2 days for discussion and voting the last 2 years that I have had the pleasure and honor of attending for West Grove UMC.

There were 10 resolutions voted upon. Church of the Open Door, Avondale UMC and Gradyville UMC were discontinued. Grandview UMC requested disaffiliation. There were various resolutions addressing benefits, retirement security and clergy compensation. It was further decided to sell up to 50+/- acres at Camp Innabah to compensate for difficulties faced due to the pandemic and the need for camp to be cancelled this past summer.

Bishop Peggy Johnson's opening message was based on Colossians 2:1-5, Paul's appeal for the church to be "knit together in love". "For though I am absent in body, yet I am with you in spirit, rejoicing to see your good order and the firmness of you faith in Christ."

2 deacons and 10 elders were commissioned and ordained in a live streamed service. There were 33 saints honored in the Memorial Service which was also live streamed.

Dear Members and Friends of the Eastern Pennsylvania Annual Conference,

As the holy seasons approach and virus fatigue is at an all-time high, we are also experiencing a resurgence of COVID-19 infections in our state. I ask you, I beg you to heed the directives of the Pennsylvania Health Department and your city and county health officials.

We must all wear masks indoors and outdoors, and continue vigilant hand-washing and social distancing. Travel should be restricted; and if you do leave the state, you should receive a negative test within 72 hours before your return, as should anyone else who enters the state. Or those who do not get tested should self-quarantine for 14 days. It has been reported that 50 percent of virus transmission comes from people who do not show any symptoms.

Our churches should consider conducting worship using virtual means as much as possible. If you do gather onsite, please limit your attendance, carefully social- distance yourselves, do not sing, keep the services brief, refrain from having fellowship dinners, and use individually wrapped cups and wafers for Communion.

As Dr. Rachel Levine, the state's Commissioner of Health, said today, "It depends on us." It is our personal responsibility to protect ourselves and one another from this deadly disease.

We are all praying for the day when we can receive COVID vaccines and see this pandemic become history. That day will come sooner if we stay united and committed in our efforts to stop the spread of this virus.

Thank you for your careful vigilance. I hold you in my prayers.
