We search the horizon of our lives for signs of the future, looking for threats and also for joys and promises and promises fulfilled. "Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful." In the book, Draw the Circle, the author Mark Batterson builds his thoughts on the scripture from Colossians 4:2. We are reminded that watchfulness was an important responsibility in Biblical times among many people. People sat on the walls of their community to keep watch to see who or what was coming; what might threaten them, a storm that may be brewing, or a potential friend to host and welcome.

The ones who kept watch saw things no one else saw, often long before other people did. They had a unique perspective. Watchfulness is just as important for us today, even if we have very different ways of doing it. Watchfulness is essential for us as Christians today. Prayer and especially prayer in and for fellowship, can open up our hearts, our eyes and ears to what is really happening. Letting God lead us to see and hear, heightens our awareness as it works to engage our whole heart. That leading by God may seem like an overwhelming challenge in troubling times, yet it can be a huge blessing we can't afford to ignore. We can be God's watchmen, faithfully readying ourselves for what is unfolding for us. We are constantly being overwhelmed with stimulation, a crush of information and opinion.

It is so overwhelming that we attempt to filter it, and then we are likely to lose the vital connections, and hold on to the ones that lead us into fear, anxiety that leads to competition, anger, even hatred. As Batterson points out, we often don't see the world as it is; we see it as we are. Prayer is essential because there are things we can only come to understand and overcome when we seek the power of God's creativity in the Holy Spirit. As I write, the temperature has dropped very noticeably, and the wind chill is unbearable. Julie and I wimped out of taking our usual daily walks; it's just too cold! There are a lot of times we'd rather be comfortable than do what is healthy. It's true about our exercise of body and also our faith. In your watchfulness what do you see coming in the months and year ahead?

A way I read Psalm 130 for myself, in my own words in verses 5-8 is: I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in his word I hope; my soul wait for the LORD more than those who watch for the morning, more than those who watch for the morning. O people of God, hope in the LORD! For with the LORD there is steadfast love, and with him is the great power to redeem. It is he who will redeem us from all our iniquities, our sins, short-sightedness, and our focus on our selves, lifting us up to see the whole horizon before us by his grace. We look forward to this year that has been started, God can lead us to live our lives fully by faith.

LENTEN BIBLE STUDY BY PASTOR JIM

In the End, Light and Love Will Win

"Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." John 8:12 (NKJV)

"Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that." Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Dr. Martin Luther King was born on January 15, 1929 in Atlanta, Georgia. His birthday was approved as a federal holiday in 1983 and celebrated this year on Monday, January 18, 2021. Every year we commemorate his non-violent commitment to peace and justice. This year we do so in tears, entrenched in a deep and solemn cloud of darkness. We remember this Christian pastor, preacher and civil rights leader and some of the many powerful words he shared through Spirit-filled sermons and speeches with broken hearts. We celebrate his life and legacy amid the confluence of good and evil, light and darkness.

This year, we ponder our journey to peace during a global pandemic when 400,000 American lives have been lost in one year due to the COVID-19 virus. We pray for peace upon the heels of a challenged presidential election, a critical senatorial election in Georgia, and a dark and violent insurrection on the steps of the United States Capitol. We hoped for peace even while the walls of the Capitol were stormed, and the rotunda and the corridors of the building, which are the symbol of the American people and government, were desecrated. We give God praise for a theology of peace lived out through Dr. King, an ordinary man in extraordinary times, that speaks to us at such a time as this. This year, we acknowledge Dr. King, who gave his life for God and humanity as we witness the 2021 Inauguration Day. This week, Joe Biden became the 46th president of the United States of America, and Kamala Harris became the first female vice president in the history of the country, a proud woman of Black and Asian descent. So many God-designed firsts are already happening. These have been dark days, and yet I am sure that the light of Christ shines brightly through the clouds. I am persuaded that God's unconditional, perfect love destroys hatred.

The time is now for people of faith to step forward, for FAITH SEES BEST IN THE DARKNESS. This is our time. Let's not miss it. It is God ordained.



Mighty Writers Work Continues

One of the extraordinary blessings of this season of virus has been to take part and help host the Mighty Writers, an organization that helps to teach English to people from bilingual families. Every Friday they have labored to share the food they have gathered from a variety of sources all over the region. Recently one week, I put together two handouts, one explaining who we are as a church and sending the welcome for when we reopen, and another inviting prayer requests. We've had a few people respond with their need for prayers. It blesses us to reach out and share fellowship with others. We will continue to look for creative ways that the Holy Spirit may lead us to share our ministries in new, vital ways with our community as we build the family of faith God envisions for us. Thank you for your faithful support of all of our efforts.

From John's Hopkins Hospital

This Covid-19 virus is not a living organism. It is a protein molecule (RNA or DNA) covered by a protective layer of lipid (fat), which, when absorbed by the cells of the ocular (eyes), nasal (nose) or buccal mucosa (mouth), changes their genetic code (mutates) and converts into aggressor and multiplier cells.

- * Since the virus is not a living organism, but is a protein molecule, it cannot be killed. It has to decay on its own.

 The disintegration time depends on the temperature, humidity and type of material where it lies.
- * The covid-19 virus is very fragile; the only thing that protects it is a thin outer layer of fat and that is the reason why soap or detergent is the best weapon. The foam CUTS THE FAT (that is why you have to scrub for 20 seconds or more, to create lots of foam). By dissolving the fat layer, the protein molecule disperses and breaks down.
- * HEAT melts fat; this is why it is necessary to use water above 77F or 25C degrees for hand washing, laundry and cleaning surfaces. In addition, hot water makes more foam, making it more effective.
 - * Alcohol or any mixture with alcohol over 65% DISSOLVES ALL FAT, especially the external lipid layer of the virus.
 - * Any solution with 1 part bleach and 5 parts water directly dissolves the protein, breaking it down from the inside.
- * Oxygenated water increases the effectiveness of soap, alcohol and chlorine, because peroxide dissolves the virus protein. However, because you have to use it in its pure form, it can damage your skin.
- * NO BACTERICIDE OR ANTIBIOTIC WILL WORK because the virus is not a living organism like bacteria; antibodies cannot kill what is not alive.

- * The virus molecules remain very stable at colder temperatures, including air conditioning in houses and cars. They also need moisture and darkness to stay stable. Therefore, dehumidified, dry, warm and bright environments will degrade the virus faster.
- * UV LIGHT on any object that may contain the virus breaks down the protein. Be careful, it also breaks down collagen (which is protein) in the skin.
 - * The virus CANNOT go through healthy skin.
- * Vinegar is NOT useful because it does not break down the protective layer of fat. * NO SPIRITS, NOR VODKA, serve. The strongest vodka is only 40% alcohol, and you need a minimum of 65%.
 - * LISTERINE is 65% alcohol.
- * The more confined the space, the higher the concentration of the virus there can be. The more open or naturally ventilated, the less.
- * You have to wash your hands before and after touching any commonly used surfaces such as: mucosa (mouth area), food, locks, knobs, switches, remotes, cell phones, watches, computers, desks etc. and don't forget when you use the bathroom.
- * You have to MOISTURIZE YOUR HANDS due to frequent washing. Dry hands have cracks and the molecules can hide in the micro cracks. The thicker the moisturizer, the better.
- * Also keep your NAILS SHORT so that the virus does not hide there.

2021 Tools For Ministry March 13, 2021 8:30 AM - 12:30 PM via Zoom "To equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ." Ephesians 4:12

The Eastern PA Conference's 2021 Tools for Ministry, **March 13, from 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM,** will make history by being **totally online for the first time**, rather than being held in onsite district locations. Offering virtual classrooms on Zoom for this annual, half-day academy of learning for church leaders is yet another way the Conference is adapting to the COVID-19 pandemic and overcoming required social-distancing restrictions against large gatherings.

Ironically, that adaptation is bearing fruit in allowing the Conference to offer a cornucopia of 35 diverse, online courses taught by expert faculty, all for a nominal registration fee of only \$5. And even more fruit may result from a record-breaking turnout, due to the convenience, affordability and growing acceptance of online, home-based adult learning. Bishop Peggy Johnson will begin the morning plenary with devotions. An offering, using text-to-give on smartphones, or mailed options, will be received to support the antiracism and justice work of POWER, an interfaith community organization to which some Eastern PA Conference churches belong. The 35 workshops cover a wide array of interesting and helpful subjects. One is in Spanish and another will be offered bilingually in English and Spanish. The workshops will be offered in two 90-minute sessions-beginning at 9:00 and 10:45 AM, with a break in-between. 


