"Fear God, do what he tells you." Ecclesiastes 12:13 (The Msg)

I worked and worshipped with a young man in a church many years ago. He was great in his enthusiasm for our faith and personal relationships with Christ. One of the most overused words in his vocabulary was "awesome!" He said it all the time, and I mean, all the time. He had a great enthusiasm for life. "That's awesome!" Was a common expression when he ate something he liked, had a fun time, or when he evaluated an event. The word awesome has an important, deep meaning for us

as Christians. Life and creation are awe-inspiring; it is all a miracle, and we celebrate together in worship. In its own way, the word awesome is really a word to be reserved for when we express our perception that something or someone is of a sacred, miraculous nature.

When we have an engaging experience with God, better words than the word "fear" that the Bible names, would at times be better said as reverence. We might also use the word awe; yet awe has been so overused by marketing people to get us to buy something, to join in and experience an event or a service being sold to us, that it can feel watered down, too common to express our relationship with God. We are, as Christians, always looking for ways to share our incredible relationship with God with other people; the relationship wasn't meant to be kept to ourselves and becomes stronger, more joyful in sharing; we need fellowship with each other.

Today there are people who will say they don't believe in God or that there is God. As Christians, we know that the danger of such an approach to life is that as human beings, when God is not at the center, we are likely to make something else our god. Maybe it's our possessions, or status, our job, or another person; perhaps what takes the center of our lives is our feelings or desires. The Bible has an expectation that we will believe in God, and makes it clear, whether we choose to set God in our lives or not, we always have a relationship with Him. The question is what will the relationship be? How will we describe it as we share our faith with others?

We want to see God in truth as the One who is majestic, sacred, and holy, the One with extensive wisdom, who is wondrous and awe inspiring. We cannot "whittle him down" to the size of our small minds and hearts. Nor can we confine God only within boundaries we are comfortable with. When we do, we cut ourselves off from life, creation, and the joy and purpose of our lives, and the possibilities before us and our loved ones. So, when the Bible expresses fear of God, we pray we are not scared as much as we are experiencing the awe and reverence we want to have, and God wants us to have in our relationship with God and our approach to the lives we are living.

May God bless you all with experiences that are truly full of awe, reverence, that are sacred and holy. I look forward to sharing fellowship together. – Tim

We try to observe social distancing and the church continues to be disinfected before the service and throughout the week. Regrettably, we cannot offer coffee fellowship yet, but you are encouraged to fellowship after the worship service.



Cottage Fellowships are Back!! "Get to Know Pastor Tim and julie"

It has been a little over a year since Pastor Tim took over as our pastor. When Pastor Tim and his wife Julie came to us, the country was in the midst of a pandemic of epic proportions. Normally when a new pastor takes over, the church holds a series of Cottage Fellowships in which the congregation meets in small groups on an informal basis with the pastor and his wife to simply get to know each other.

Typically these Cottage Fellowships are held in the homes of members who act as host. Nothing about this past year has been normal. Due to the restrictions imposed by the pandemic, we were unable as a church to offer a proper welcome to Pastor Tim and Julie. Holding anything in the way of a Cottage Fellowship was simply out of the question. Although Pastor Tim has made great strides in getting to know us in spite of these challenges, we, the Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC), feel that it would be beneficial to all concerned, if we were to go ahead and host a series of Cottage Fellowships in the latter part of August. We are slowly returning back to some kind of normal with attendance in Worship starting to increase, plans for having Sunday school return in September, the much anticipated rummage sale on the calendar for October, CMO up and running, and here this past week a very successful live VBS. These long overdue Cottage Fellowships could serve the dual purpose to not only allow us to get better acquainted with Pastor Tm and Julie but serve as an opportunity for us all to get re-acquainted, as hopefully we can finally put this pandemic behind us and come back this Fall in full swing.

Our intent is to keep the number of participants in each session small to perhaps no more than 10 families to a allow for an open and free flow of thoughts and ideas, questions and insights, joys and concerns, hopes and aspirations, and as Pastor Tim likes to say "our stories". More specifics will be forthcoming via a formal invitation, constant contact, Sunday morning's ministry opportunities and the bulletin. Blessing of the Backpacks



Acknowledging that we are not fully back to normal, the annual conference Laity Academy will host two learning events in 2021. The theme is "Handle with Care Love."

The first academy is August 6-7, Friday evening and all-day Saturday, using Zoom video-conferencing. The second will be on October 1-

2, when in-person classes will be hosted at several churches across the conference.
