Some of the conversation and interest turned to where the church is going and favorite ministries many would like to see return as we return to full participation in the months and year ahead. Great!

It is great to come together and as we talk friendship as friends in faith with Christ, we often also start talking business. We don't ever want to be all business in every meeting. In Christ, real friendship is required. They both go hand in hand and we need to weave the two dynamics together. I've known many churches that faced difficulty in staying too focused on the church as enterprise, or all business, when we need to be intentional about sharing personal friendships in faith that are intentional about building trust. 

MONTHLY GATHERING





Making a provision to West Grove UMC in your estate planning is as simple as a couple of lines included into your will. This is something you can do now.

For assistance with this important feature of your own discipline of stewardship, talk with your financial planner or just call the church office. More elaborate gift bequests can be brokered through the church professionals at the Mid-Atlantic Foundation. Consider leaving a tithe (10%) of your estate to West Grove UMC at your death...or

even a flat gift amount which you specify...and then enjoy the length of your days knowing a part of your legacy will be impacting generations to come to share the good news in this community. Pastor Jim



SENIORS AND THEIR RMD

The changes in the income tax law now allows Seniors, who have IRA's and are required to take a yearly RMD (Required Minimum Distribution), can make a QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution) from their IRA account to a charity like West Grove UMC and still satisfy the RMD. The advantage is the amount of the QCD which is given to the church, is directly taken off your income tax and you can still claim the standard

deduction if you do not itemize.

By doing this, you lower your taxable income and you give a charitable gift to our church. To do this you must ask your IRA custodian for the forms for the QCD. They need to deduct your gift from your RMD and they will send it directly to West Grove UMC and you will get your RMD amount less the charitable gift. Both you and our church are winners.


