"There has never been the slightest doubt in my mind that the God who started this great work in you would keep at it and bring it to a flourishing finish."

Philippians 1:6 (The Message)

Good, loving parents want blessings for their children. God does too, even more so for all of us. In his work, <u>Run with the Horses</u>, Peterson writes that the purpose of religion is not to make people feel good, but to make them good. Love is important and God loves us, "But his love is passionate and seeks faithful, committed love in return. (Like a good parent) God does not want pets to fondle and feed: God wants mature, free people who will respond to him in authentic individuality (not robotic reactions). For that to happen there must be honesty and truth. The self must be toppled from its pedestal. There must be pure hearts and clear intelligence, confession of sin and commitment to faith."

Easter brings incredible promises to us for eternity and for our lives every day. We can put resurrection into the every day practices of our lives, as God's creativity sets us free to live in the strength and newness that God provides. It means being patient with each other; seeking understanding and wisdom together instead of being divided in debate or competition. Where we may have felt trapped, confined, and imprisoned in life, God seeks to bring forth salvation with new possibilities. When we live in the new possibilities, we are, as Peterson called it in his book, <u>Practicing Resurrection</u>, putting our faith into practice.

It is vital that as Christians we put faith into practice, making our relationship with Christ the very real foundation of our lives and relationships. I can think of a wonderful, faithful physician who, even though he has aged over the years and retired many years ago, has never really stopped practicing his calling, however limited it may be. When someone needs healing, he is quick to take the time to connect and share his attention and the grace God has entrusted to him. To live in the faithful lifestyle of disciples, we need each other to continue in trusted friendships, sharing and growing in God's presence. As we move past the limits of the virus, I continue to urge you to strengthen your participation in our fellowship. We continue to have several areas of ministry we need your help in.

Great Resignation

It has been called the "great resignation" by those who have followed the trend; because of the virus, many Americans have reevaluated their lives and its meaning and adjusted their priorities, to reflect a new awakening that focuses on life's meaning and purpose. The result is many people have resigned from their jobs to take new ones, or take some time off to reevaluate life and do things they have always wanted to do, or spend more time with people they love. Many people are trying to identify their priorities, and stay more focused on their higher priorities than they have in the past. I pray that as part of our prayer lives and devotions, we are all, always in tune with the higher priorities God has for us, for our hearts and minds. It is so easy to be distracted away from the blessings God's presence provides.

A group of ladies who faced a lot of adversity in life who I was honored to minster with, adopted for their theme in life, Paul's letter to the Philippians: "I can do all things *through Christ* who strengthens me." (Philippians 4:13) They brought the practice of resurrection into their lives and community, aware of the choices they made every day to live in God's power. I know we can continue to do so too. Resurrection is a reality for us all, to be lived every day. I pray God continues to help us claim the miracle of life he has entrusted to us all.

Books of Worth Sharing




A couple of people have asked me about the books I named and made reference to in the meditation on Easter Sunday. They

THE EXTENT OF CHRIST'S LOVE

During our recent Ephesians Bible study on Monday nights during Lent, Paul prayers for the church at Ephesus, praying that they may grasp the extent and power of the love of Jesus.



"And I pray that

you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ." (Eph. 3:17a-18).

We live in a three-dimensional world of width, length, and height. But if you look at this verse you will see Paul speaks of four dimensions, wide, long, high, and deep! So how does the love of God exist in four dimensions?

John MacArthur, Jr. in his book, <u>God, Coming Face to Face with His Majesty</u>, helps to explain the dimensions of God's love in Christ. John says, 1.) "How broad (wide) is His love? Broad enough to reconcile Jew and Gentile and make

them one in Christ". The study in Ephesians was entitled, "The Unity of the Church in Christ", speaking about unifying the Jews and Gentiles into one body, together, called the church. 2.) "How long is His love? Long enough to stretch from eternity past."

3.) "How deep is His love? Deep enough to reach us when we were dead in our

trespasses and sin." 4.) "How high is His love? High enough to raise us up and seat us in heaven with Him."

As Christians, it is the love of Jesus that gives us the power to live and to love others. Its **breadth** – can reach anyone. Its **length** – runs from eternity past to eternity future. Its **depth** – it reaches down to the vile bottom of sin. Its **height** – it takes us into the very presence of God, the Father, and the Son, in heaven. That is the power of Christ's love for us, and we should build our life upon it and share that love with others.

This year, we are heading to Discovery on Adventure Island!






Children's Morning Out and Preschool

Warm Greetings to you all! We have all been on quite a journey these last few years - including Family Prom-

ise. Ever since we moved our families into the space generously donated by Square Roots, Inc., and now serve families who are "doubled-up" with friends or family, we have been working to come up with the best way to serve families in need of emergency housing. We considered buying, renovating, and purchasing a location. We looked into multiple solutions, including trailers, and even tiny houses. We have finally landed on apartment rental.

Beginning this month, we are able to house one family in need of emergency housing. Another apartment will become available in July. We hope to be able to expand this program throughout southern Chester County as we obtain funding. The program model of intensive case management is still in place. The expectation is that the families will stay with us, on average, for 3 months. During that time, they will be able to focus on goals, including finding affordable housing.



In addition, we're also working to strengthen our program to meet the needs of the families after they have moved in. We now have a Housing Specialist, Guillermo Rivera, who has been a van driver for us, helping us to find affordable housing, and work with landlords.

Come join us and be entertained by our own Board Member - George Lock as he performs with The Mayo Family Band, a blue grass band. They will be playing from 7pm to 9pm.


Eastern PA Conference "Learning for Leaders" May 2022 Book Club:




West Grove UMC Calendar of Events
