

She loved her work here in our CMO, intended staying and serving here for a while, and has been very faithful in her service to Christ with the children. Her church and its school came calling on her, several times this summer, deeply in need of a third-grade teacher. After many contacts, she decided to take the position, and we are blessed that while she is answering her call to ministry in new ways, Abbie Gruscavage a former teacher at our preschool who is moving back into the area, has responded to our CMO need, and taken the director position.

A great joy that I want to lift up as an example for all, is that out of their love for the children and the ministry here in our preschool, before Abbie decided to take the position, while she was still considering it, the staff got together and invited Abbie to come to one of their homes for a meeting, to encourage her to take the responsibilities of the director. They assured her of their commitment and their willingness to help continue to make the CMO a ministry that blesses the children and their families. They have created and continued a great culture here for our community. They surrounded her with the type of fellowship and culture our CMO has been known for, and we look forward to the year ahead.

We have also hired several new staff members to help complete the classes we are offering. We still have one or two positions to fill, and are very expectant and prayerful about our efforts going forward. This year we have been blessed by several donations that will be used to offer scholarships to some of the families in need. Please be prayerful about the ways we support our CMO preschool, as we connect the families with God in Christ, and if you see ways you might help in our efforts, please speak with Pastor Tim, or come and say hello to Abbie, and welcome her into our ministries.

A great gift of strength and clarity of our purpose here as a Christian fellowship is lifted up into our hearts when we engage with the children. We seek God's vision and empowerment, remembering the scripture: "Keep alert, stand firm in your faith, be courageous, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love." 

In Disciple Bible Study participants spend about a half hour every day reading several chapters in the Bible; they then meet together once a week for about two hours at the church to view a short video and share what they have read in more detail. It is a time of strengthening our practice of devotions and living in great fellowship together while listening and hearing a more complete way to relate with God together, blessed by sharing with others in God's Word. We cover 85% of the Bible in 36 weeks, a couple of chapters every day, as we meet every week, viewing a summary video and sharing what we heard from God. Discernment About Disaffiliation



Our Conference is offering all churches the opportunity to understand the process of disaffiliation from the denomination and what it involves. About thirty churches have already identified that they would like to go out into a new denomination that is forming. In an effort to make the process a healthy one, the Conference is offering to have someone come to our church, and make a presentation helping us discern how we will go forward. I don't think anyone on the Board is interested in seeing the church break away from the UMC as it is now. We do believe it is our responsibility to make sure all that we can is communicated to the fellowship about the decision to stay or leave, and the process involved.



Changes to our Church Food Pantry

It's been 2 1/2 years since we started pre-bagging food and delivering it to individuals and families waiting in their cars. As time passed, and pandemic protocols became more lenient, we began inviting people into the church to select some of their food and help to carry the food to their cars. We have just now moved to a food distribution model where the people come inside to do all of their own selection.

Some reasons for the change have been the loosening of COVID restrictions, the increased amount of produce and protein that we are receiving from the food bank, the generous donation of eggs from several members in the community and the bakery items that Acme has been donating. We also want people to be able to select the foods that they and their families will enjoy, without giving foods that will not be consumed. The idea is to make the pantry as much like a regular grocery shopping experience

as possible, providing dignity and a sense of being able to care for ones own family.

Fortunately, our pantry budget has been well funded the past several years, so we have been able to purchase four small shopping carts. Since the Chester County Food Bank is not receiving the number of donations of shelf stable foods they did previously, we are having to purchase more of the food that we give to the clients. We are seeing an uptick in the number of families using our food pantry as the cost of groceries has soared. We are all experiencing that reality, but if you are able to donate to our food pantry, either with food or monetarily, so that we can purchase food in bulk, your generosity would be greatly appreciated. If you make a financial gift you can indicate it is for the food pantry in the memo on your check. If you give cash, an envelope with the designation of food pantry will work well.

For those choosing to donate food, here is the list of most needed items.

canned fruits.


