"So, if you're serious about living this new resurrection life with Christ, act like it. Pursue the things over which Christ presides. Don't shuffle along, eyes to the ground, absorbed with the things right in front of you.

Look up, and be alert to what is going on around Christ —that's where the action is. See things from his perspective. (Colossians 6:1-2, The Message)

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. (Colossians 6:16, NRSV)

I recently read an article by Dave Helmuth in a blog that he sends out to church leaders, in which he tries to "fertilize" our sense and practices of worship. He reminds us, we all need to sing, even with our varying (inadequate) abilities; singing is a sacred gift that ignites our hearts, minds, and souls in expression of what is sacred. God is worthy of our full attention and the expressions in singing are vital for our faith and relationship with God and each other. Singing is an exercise of the heart and soul, preparing us for future challenges and opportunities.

He writes: (God) is "worthy, whether or not "I feel up to it," whether or not "I'm moved by the music," whether or not "I like the way the sound is mixed," whether or not "I can sing along beautifully with the songs," whether or not "I like the style of the music." And beyond His worth, there's this reality: I need to sing. We need to sing! Not "I want to sing" but "I NEED to sing!" We need to sing, together.

When we sing, we show honor, respect to God, as we teach and admonish through the songs we sing, as Colossians 6 envisions. Nurture can happen from a variety of directions or approaches, teaching positively, or warning about potential problems. The message of Christ is at the foundation or core of who we are, and what we sing. What God has done and is doing and will do for us in Christ, needs to be woven deeply within us, "dwell in us richly." The sacrifice of the Cross and the creativity of the Resurrection will transform lives. What the passage teaches us is that one of the great ways we learn and weave it all into our hearts, minds, and lives is by singing. It becomes a sacred, empowering experience, especially in the joy of community in fellowship together. There is a great gift in being in rhythm and in tune (as best we can) with one another.

Music has such a strong impact, full of blessings that just reading or talking will not provide. It means a lot to me to be singing both the songs my grandparents knew, and singing ones they never heard, because they had not yet been written. Engaged in new creativity, inspires more creativity, and opens up hearts and minds, taking in and exploring new possibilities. I remember accounts of when John and Charles Wesley were writing new hymns for their day, that they were often criticized for their compositions. It is hard to imagine there was so much criticism about some of our most beloved hymns, shared for the last 200 years, but there was. They challenged others, and us today, to make sure the songs we share and sing always give glory to God. I have to confess, I have quite a collection of rock and roll music, and probably would stir up a response from Wesley if he were here today. I've got to believe he'd appreciate the creativity in my jazz collection.

We sing to God, in God's creativity, not just about God. When we sing, we are relating with God and one another, fulfilling the Shema, (Love the Lord your God with all your heart and your neighbor as yourself), in very unique ways. Music pulls us into experiences that are beyond words, and can pull us beyond ourselves, and our small, narrow ways of thinking and living. When we sing emersed in faith, we are not singing abstract truths and principles, but we're singing about who God is and how God affects who we are. Music can shape our identity and transform how we feel. I pray you join us, and join in every Sunday. For we are striving and building a fellowship in trust in the heart of God in Christ. You can be an essential part of it. God's blessings to all. – Tim


October 9 - 18th Sunday After Pentecost

Sexuality is a sacred part of our lives and one of the most complex dynamics we share. When we hold differing views on it, as Christians we need to take time to listen in empathy to what others have been through, to learn, grow, and mature together. The Bible is full of stories about faith journeys, and those stories are not always complimentary of the people who lived them, but the stories are seeking to lift up God's faithfulness, and the ways God has helped bless and nurture life, and our relationship with Him. They teach us as they can prepare us for life's challenges, and they enrich and help to multiply our blessings. It is vital we strive and work to be active listeners, and understand one another's experiences and points of view. Much of the Bible's guideline and laws are entrusted to us, so that we might have more trusting, intimate relationships, where we can be more ready to share and grow from insights together, and build a closer, deeper community together.

Stories also heal, as they provide identity and understanding; they can help nurture empathy, as they stretch us to understand God and one another. Sharing stories is a way to honor the Shema, You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength, and love your neighbor as yourself. I have learned so much from the stories that people have shared with me. You are invited to come and share your story to help in our understanding together in the larger community of faith. In a world so polarized and divided we have choices we can make to live faithfully in the grace and fellowship God has entrusted to us.

Disaffiliation of a Discernment Process Saturday, October 29, 9AM Your Attendance Is Important

The United Methodist Church is going through an extreme transition, as many churches are trying to discern whether or not they want to continue to take part in the denomination's structure and guidelines found in our covenant together in the Book of Discipline. Many churches, for a variety of reasons, have started to break away and form a new denomination, the Global Methodist Church. At the last General Conference six years ago, guidelines to a process for disaffiliation were presented and approved, and many churches are choosing to move forward with disaffiliation for a variety of reasons. The virus interfered with the process in many ways. Our Conference in Eastern PA has offered churches the opportunity to have trained, informed pastors come in and make a presentation about the discernment process for disaffiliation. Having them come for an initial presentation does not obligate us to go forward with disaffiliation or the process of discernment.

Because we believe it wise to make informed decisions, the Ad Council Board voted to have the two pastors come and present information about what the process would be, then right after the presentation all the members of our church who are present, will vote whether or not to go further in hearing and understanding more about the discernment process of disaffiliation. It is not that the Ad Council wants to disaffiliate; it is that we believe we want everyone to be as informed as we can be at this time. All church members are invited and encouraged to attend. We regret that this process is as limited as it is in time; it is what the Conference has offered and made available to us, and we want to make the most of what time and freedom we have, and not be passive, just allowing events to lead us.

Rev Dori Newcomer and Rev Mark Terry will make the presentation on **Saturday, October 29 starting at 9AM**. We do not expect the time to go beyond noon. There will be time for discussion after their presentation, and then time to vote as a congregation. **Only members of the church will be able to vote**. We urge you to join us in the gathering, and also in our prayers together, that we focus on listening and understanding God and one another. I encourage you to meet with me, Pastor Tim, with questions and/or concerns you may have.

You may be remembering a loved one this year. We would like to give thanks to God for their life in our All Saints Day service on November 7th .



GET YOUR CLEARANCES UP-TO-DATE

IT'S EASY AND WE WILL HELP YOU!

With Sunday School for children and youth starting up again, I'd like to remind everyone of the Safe Sanctuaries policy for the district. If you are an adult working with children or youth, you will need to obtain clearances

from the state. This would include any volunteers for the Nursery, Sunday School or Youth group. The clearances would include a Criminal Record Check and Child Abuse Clearance. If you have already obtained those clearances as a volunteer for another organization or for work, we only need a copy. These need to be renewed every three years for our records. Also if you have not lived in PA for 10 years, you will need the FBI Fingerprint check.

This may sound a bit overwhelming if you've never done it, but **it's actually pretty easy and most can be done online**. For the Criminal Background Check, the website is epatch.state.pa.us. Be sure to check the volunteer box and there will be no charge. For the Child Abuse Clearance, the web site is compass.state.pa.us/cwis. If you'd rather apply on paper, I have forms you can fill out and mail in. If you've been volunteering, we'll get in touch with you when you need clearances to be renewed.

Another part of the Safe Sanctuaries policy requires two adults working with children. Since we cannot always have two Sunday School teachers, we use a Roamer as the second adult during the Sunday School hour. The Roamer doesn't stay in the classroom, but roams the hall where the classrooms and Nursery are located. The Roamer is available for helping the teacher if needed. We'd love to have a few more Roamers on our list. If you are available during the Sunday School hour and would be interested in volunteering, contact me, Fran Miller, at jmille8698@verizon.net or call me at 484-614-6627. I'd be happy to help you obtain clearances as well.
