Regarding life together and getting along with each other....just love one another!" (I Thessalonians 4:9 The Message)

There are times when I read Paul's words and totally agree with him, and then there are times when I think, if only it were that easy! Truth is, it is easy and at the same time a great life challenge, when we are keeping close and discipled with Jesus Christ. God loves us all, and God will provide the empowerment we need. In his book Travelling Light, Eugene Peterson tells us there are two dynamics we need to remember: "there is no even distribution of strengths, the blessings and difficulties, as challenges are unevenly distributed." The second dynamic to remember is some people have heavier loads placed on them than others – burdens of illness, work, family, emotional trauma. And not all of us get equal strengths. Some are born with strong bodies and fragile emotions, others with robust emotions and weak bodies.

Once we understand these aspects of life, "we will not arrogantly separate ourselves from others when we find ourselves strong, nor will we withdraw in gravelling self-pity when we find ourselves weak." We don't call others, "strange," or say they are "stranger than us as strangers;" we are all God's children. As Christians living in God's grace, we are free to share both weakness and strengths, burdens and abilities. We all face so many overwhelming challenges today with so much division over a variety of issues. God is with us in the midst of it all. Our church fellowship needs to embody God's grace and be a source of hope in life for all. Thank you for your participation, and we pray we might all come to perceive how we are blessed when we relate with each other in God's grace to appreciate the variety of journeys we have experienced. We can learn from each other and help each other grow in understanding when God leads us.

Leadership In Faith

Wrapping up our worship insights through the summer into fall, we learned that Abraham, Isaac,

Jacob, Joseph, and Moses all learned to live life more fully by personally engaging, even wrestling with God every day. After he came down the mountain, Moses found the people worshiping an idol, instead of patiently waiting on God. He became very angry, and through his experience, Moses learned many lessons. He was very candid with God, trusting God to respond in real ways. Moses asked God, who would be with him in his efforts in leadership? Moses pressed God to be in partnership with him. He knew he could never provide leadership on his own, and then he also realized that all of the people needed to get closer to God, and take the covenant into their hearts and weave it into the ways they (& & we) live life every day. For us as disciples of Jesus Christ, it is essential, vital that we too seek to understand the heart of God as much as we can, and are called to allow God to lead our efforts in leadership.

We've shared our hearts, and learned a lot together, and have a lot more to learn. I've asked the group to continue to meet in preparation for the holidays and offer our time to our church and the community. We've been very blessed to have Clara, a woman who is not a member of our church, whose husband died earlier this year, join us for our weekly meeting. We all have a workbook, and we watch a video as we share our memories and experiences and response to the material. The group is considering sharing the study again, because there is so much to take in, we need more than just one time. We would like to invite others to take part, for we can also see how grief impacts us all and is at the core of many of the tensions and the distance people are experiencing.

Color of Compromise

Special thanks to Mel Leaman and Peter Mullen for offering the study the Color of Compromise in helping us understand how our faith, fellowship in our church can be stronger and more faithful to God. We always seek the truth and entrust ourselves to God, so that we might grow and mature in His love and grace. The group continues to meet on Saturday mornings and by Zoom on other evenings. Many who are taking part are not members of our church, and are willing to grow in understanding. Our faith always faces the danger of being distorted, and our priority is to make sure we stay close to God and be open to the truth as God transforms. Please contact Mel or Peter if you have an interest in taking part or reading the book; there is also a workbook that guides participants in devotions through the study. Mel and Peter have been intentional about bringing scripture, and God's perspective to what has happened, and how God will lead us to heal the past and current prejudice that so many people are entrapped in. Please keep our ministries in your prayers.

Children and Youth Ministries

For five years we were blessed to have Melanie Jones serving here as our children and youth ministry director. We pray for God's blessings as she moves forward, continuing her work in an after school program and also joining and leading a fellowship in New Jersey, while earning a master's degree in social work and counseling. We are searching for a new person to help lead our efforts; we need more than a program director, we need to keep ministry as our first priority. I pray we make the most of this time to renew our fellowship's focus on having us all grow in faith through our efforts. We are doing more than increasing our children and youth's knowledge of God, Jesus Christ, and God's Word, we all want to help each other grow closer to God in personal ways.

Children and youth have a lot to teach us, in helping us grow in the ways we know and remember that we are loved by God, and share it in fellowship together. Perhaps many people forget just how much we and they are loved by God, and what a difference it can make to share his heart, and the joy it can bring. Yet perhaps with the disappointments so many people experience with a variety of leaders, Christ is the one we can count on and turn to for wisdom, embodying grace and mercy. We will focus on a story for our meditation that Jesus told that greatly challenges us all to be aware of the impact of our lives. It is found in Matthew 25:31-46, and we will hear a reading from Psalm 100, along with references to Ezekiel 34:11-16, 20-24, where God promises to personally be our Shepherd and help us when we are distressed. (the true mark of a real King); and Ephesians 1:15-23, a prayer for wisdom and guidance in the presence of God through Christ.

We look forward to preparing the Way for Christ to come into our lives, building on trustworthy practices that have helped faithful people for generations know that God is coming into our lives in creative ways. PASTOR JIM'S CHRISTIAN LIVING COLUMN

—God Watches Over Us As We Journey in Life—

November 2023

With all that is happening in Israel we should look at this land. The land of Israel is the most important place on earth. The most important city is not Washington or Moscow, but Jerusalem. The most important land, believe it or not, is not America but tiny Israel, about the size of New Jersey.

What does the Bible have to say about Israel? Israel: the geographic center. "See, I have set thee in the midst of the nations (Ezekiel 5:5). Israel, called "the navel of the earth," is strategically located at the hub of three continents.

Israel: the revelation center. From this land, the land of Moses, the prophets and the apostles, came the Word of God. It was here that the Word of God speaks of, tells history of, and is the center of all that is to come.

Israel: the spiritual center. In Bethlehem Jesus was born.
In Nazareth He grew to maturity. In Galilee He walked and taught on the mountainsides and beside the Sea. In Jerusalem our Lord was crucified, buried, and rose from the dead. From the

Mount of Olives He ascended. And to the Mount of Olives He will return; His feet will first touch down upon the Mount of Olives On that day his feet will stand on the Mount of Olives, east of Jerusalem, and the Mount of Olives will be split in two from east to west, forming a great valley, with half of the mountain moving north and half moving south. (Zechariah 14:4).

Israel: the prophecy center. Prophecy is "prewritten history." The land of Israel is the only land belonging to God's people. The details of their future are minutely recorded in the Bible. If you want to know what God is doing, study Israel and her people.

Israel: the storm center. The Middle East, specifically Israel, is the world's greatest trouble spot. The Bible says "Jerusalem will be a burdensome stone for all people" of the world - (Zechariah 12:3), and indeed we see in the daily news the gathering storm clouds of Armageddon. On that day, when all the nations of the earth are gathered against her, I will make Jerusalem an immovable rock for all the nations. All who try to move it will injure themselves.

Israel: the peace center. We're told to "pray for the peace of Jerusalem" (Psalm 122:6). There will never be peace on earth until there's peace in Jerusalem, until Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, rules, and reigns from Jerusalem. When we are praying for the peace of Jerusalem, we are praying, "Even so, come Lord Jesus." We want our Lord to reign from Zion, to sit upon the throne of his father David.

Israel: one day will be the glory center. When our Lord returns, Jerusalem will be the capital city not only of Israel but of the entire world, and the Word of the Lord shall go forth from Zion (Isaiah 2:3). 
CMO UPATE:
