WGUMC Appointed and Interim Pastor

As you may know, in the Methodist Church Pastors for local churches are appointed by the bishop on an annual basis. Terms are fixed and run from July 1 of one year to June 30th of the next. The fact that Pastor Tim retired as of January 17th, means his replacement will not be appointed until July 1 of this year. In cases like ours, where there is an extended gap between the time the former pastor leaves and the new pastor comes on board, the bishop appoints an interim. This process requires the advice and consent of the local Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC), which in our case is Cindy Haley, Cindy Hoover, Susan Paisley, Judy Gambil, Priscilla Barkman, Andrew Herman, Dan Elliott and myself as chair.

Finding and appointing an interim pastor to take us through to July 1st has taken somewhat longer than anticipated. West Grove however, has been especially blessed in that we have two uniquely qualified men who have stepped up to fill the gap, Jim Mundell and Mel Leaman. Jim, Mel - thank you for your faithfulness, dedication, sacrifice and plain hard work in keeping us together during this time. That being said, I am pleased to announce that as of this past week, an interim has been appointed who will fill in until our new pastor comes on board July 1. I am even more pleased to announce that she is no stranger to West Grove - Pastor Janice Bowers. Janice will serve as our lead pastor, albeit on an interim basis. Her first day on the job will be Thursday, March 14th and her first Sunday in the pulpit will be St Patrick's Day, March 17th. Due to the mandatory requirement that all leaving pastors must exit 2 Sundays before the new pastor takes over, her last Sunday will be June 16th.

While this is welcome news, I must also tell you that Janice currently serves part time as pastor for New London UMC and will continue in that capacity while serving as our interim. New London's Sunday morning worship service is at 9:00, which means she can only be available to preside and preach at our 11:00 service. Ad Council met this past Wednesday night, where, in recognition of Pastor Janice's commitment to New London, we reluctantly had to agree that it was in the best interest of the church and Janice as lead pastor to put our 8:30 service on pause during the time she is our interim. This wasn't an easy decision and I know some of you will be inconvenienced and disappointed. Looking to the future, please let us, the members of Ad Council and SPRC, know your thoughts on having two services especially those of you who have been regular attendees of the 8:30 service. In the meantime, we ask for your prayers and support as we welcome Janice and continue through this interim period. Dick Stuheke / SPRC Chair

March 3 —Third Sunday in Lent.—Rev. James Mundell

Sermon topic is: "**From Seder to Holy Communion.**" The scriptures to be used are Mark 14:12-26, dealing with the Last Supper of Jesus with His disciples, and Exodus 12:3, 5-8, 11-14, 21-23, 29-30, which deals with the Jewish "Passover." These two passages combined, speak of Holy Communion and how Jesus gave us this sacrament. The sermon will speak of the transition from the Jewish Seder to our Holy Communion.

March 10 —Fourth Sunday in Lent.—Rev. Dr. Melvin Leaman

Sermon topic is: "How Heaven Handles Hell: The Loving 'Wrath' of God". First Scripture Lesson: Psalm 22 (selected verses) Second Scripture Lesson: Romans 1:14-23; 28 God's wrath may give us up to the consequences of our choices, but God's eternal love can never let us go or forsake us. God's anger is that look of love that laments all the ways we miss the mark of God's best intent for relationships with each other and all of creation. The goodness of God is always at work within the bad we bring upon ourselves to offer restoration, not retribution. The wrath of God is not directed at the sinner, but at the destructive powers that sin brings to human experience. Heaven and hell are as close as your next choice. Ultimately, the gates of hell cannot shut out the kingdom of heaven come to earth. What thoughts do you bring to this topic?

March 17 -11:00 am Fifth Sunday in Lent—Rev. Janice Bowers

Sermon Title: "Whoever Serves" Focus scripture: John 12:25 "Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life In this world will keep it for eternal life." When we serve God utilizing our spiritual gifts, we experience joy as a result. Losing our lives to God, does not mean doing everything and anything we are asked to do. Losing our lives to God means trusting God in fulfilling what we are uniquely called to do through utilizing our spiritual gifts given to us by the Holy Spirit.

March 24 -11:00 am Passion-Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week- Rev. Janice Bowers

To have the fullest experience of this week and Easter, I encourage everyone to attend our Maundy Thursday Service at West Grove UMC and our Good Friday Service at New London UMC.

Sermon Title: **"Blessed is the One"** Focus Scripture: Mark 11:7-9 "7 Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. 8 Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. 9 Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!" The shouts of Hosanna were originally used as a prayer for God's saving action. While those yelling it were not aware that the time had actually arrived, they yelled it in hopes of a coming Messiah – unaware that it was in Jesus himself.

March 28, 7:00 pm -Maundy Thursday- Rev. Janice Bowers

Sermon Title: **"By This Everyone Will Know"** Maundy Thursday is a monumental day in Holy Week. We recognize Jesus' love for us and our love for all in the washing of the feet. This leads into the institution of the Lord's Supper. Let us join in this Holy time together as we prepare our hearts for the passion on Good Friday and the resurrection of Easter Sunday.

March 29, 6:00 pm (New London)-Good Friday-Rev. Janice Bowers

We will be holding a Service of Tenebrae, or "Shadows," with our brothers and sisters at New London UMC. Please come together as we experience the Passion of Christ as he answers to Pilate in John 18:36 "My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom Is not from here." Let us see Jesus not just as a our personal king, but as king for our community and for all of creation.

March 31, 6:45 am. (New London UMC) Easter Sunrise Service- Rev. Janice Bowers

We will gather outside the hall and cemetery of New London UMC around a bonfire. The first known Easter sunrise service was held in Herrnhut, Germany in 1732 where a small group of Moravians went to a local cemetery for a special time of worship. As Mary Magdelene went to the tomb on the first Easter Sunday, these followers celebrated at the graves of the faithful. This tradition continues today as we prepare for the resurrected Christ and the coming of a great light.

Sermon title: "You Are Looking for Jesus" Arrive this morning to the beauty of the altar being covered in daffodils, lilies, and tulips! Let us look together for Jesus. "ON MY FATHER'S SIDE"

Jesus amongst the teachers of the Law

As I was listening to a Christian radio station, I heard a song that I want to share with you. It is a song about Jesus when He was twelve years old. Jesus and His family were in Jerusalem for Passover to celebrate "The Feast of Unleavened Bread." After the feast, Mary and Joseph left to return home. Believing that Jesus was among friends and relatives, they could not find Jesus at the end of the day's journey. When they returned to the city, "they found him in the temple" amid the teachers, both hearing them and asking them questions. And all that heard him were astonished at his understanding and answers. (Luke 2:45-49).

The song is entitled "ON MY FATHER'S SIDE," written by Felecia Shifflett and sung by The Village Singers. The lyrics to the song are questions the teachers of the law may have asked Jesus and the answers Jesus may have provided from His mother's mother's side and from His Father's side. These are the lyrics:

"Just a young boy in the temple one day, shared with the doctors they were so amazed, never had they seem one so young speak so swift, they asked him many questions the conversation went like this.

What is your name? On my mother's side, it is Jesus. On my Father's side, Emmanuel.

<u>Where are you from?</u> On my mother's side, I was born in Bethlehem. On my Father's side, I came from the portals of glory.

<u>How old are you?</u> On my mother's side, I am twelve years old. On my Father's side, I am from everlasting to everlasting.

<u>What religion are you?</u> On my mother's side, I am a Jew from the house of David. On my Father's side—before Abraham was, I am.

<u>Do you think you will ever amount to anything?</u> On my mother's side, I will be despised and rejected. On my Father's side, I will, throughout eternity, be worshipped and adored.

What are your plans? On my mother's side, I will go to the cross and die. On my Father's side, after three days in the tomb, I will burst forth.

<u>How will we know you?</u> On my mother's side, you will see the nail prints in my hands and feet. On my Father's side, I will be seen as a Lamb standing as if it had been slain and riding a white horse with many crowns upon my head."

This song expresses to us that Jesus had two sides: His human side and His spiritual, eternal side. To read about His human side as He suffered a mock trial and His death on the cross, I recommend you read Isaiah 53. Here is the prophecy of Jesus suffering and dying for the world. As we journey through March, we will be in the season of Lent, except for the last day, which is Easter Sunday, March 31st.

Let us all prepare our hearts to celebrate Resurrection Day on Easter Day. Pastor Jim

Healing Racism Group

The genesis of this gathering was spearheaded and facilitated by Peter Mullen and Mel Leaman in early September and continued each Saturday for twelve weeks. Peter had recruited about half of the 12 or so participants from the Honeycroft Community where he and Edel reside. This study provided a mechanism of integration between our church members and those not related to WGUMC.

They met to discuss Jemar Tisby's book "The Color of Compromise", which presented a historical look at American church's complicity in racism. This group was intentional about hearing the heart of a few black brothers who also participated and the friendships developed during the study, continue. Our Scriptures were an integral aspect of our discussions and, as one could well imagine, at times the topics were challenging.

We decided we could no longer merely discuss the issues around racism, but we must do something to confront it. In that light, we initially had a speaker come to help us understand the in's and out's and issues around voting in our locale. She encouraged us and showed us how to be more involved in the voting process.

Several weeks later we met at Peggy and John Watkins house to hear the CEO of Southern Chester County of *United Way*, Terry Vodery share the variety of ways we can assist those in need of our area. Some individuals will bring to future gatherings issues of importance to them. A few will be participating in the Poor People's March and Low-wage Worker's March in Harrisburg on March 2nd. Enduring Message to America by Keisha M. Blain.


